PARIS OFFICIAL

(Special to the Guardian.)
 PARIS, June 11.—The War Office issued the following to-day:—There is nothing important, with the exception of further success in the Labyrinth, where we have continued to force the enemy back, and some progress east of the Labyrinth, where we occupied several German side trenches not far from the highway from Arras to Lille. In the region of Hebuterne we have extended our advance north and to the south of the battle front on June 7. The occupation of several trenches at this point gave us 100 prisoners and several machine guns.
