THE adjourned sitting of the County
Court was held yesterday for judgment

Mark Wright & Co. Ltd. vs Edmund E.
Crosby; W. S. Stewart Q. C. for plain-
tiff. G. S. Inman for defendant.

EASTERN ITEMS.—Haying is about
finished, and that under unprecedented
difficulties with the extremely wet sum-
mer. The crop is a large one, but
much of it poorly cured. The wheat
crop may be said to be a failure, with
the exception of a few fields of White
Russian sowed late. Most of those are
badly affected with weevil. The
early oats are chiefly good, the late
poor, and by present appearances the
potato crop will be a poor one. Alto-
gether, the prospect for our farmers is
not an encouraging one.—The mackerel
fishery may be put down as a failure,
and under the changed conditions, the
men who made money for themselves
and others at this once important and
lucrative business have now to betake
themselves to some other calling. The
sea around the East Point, which every
summer seemed alive with schools of
this fish, now looks barren, dead and
deserted. The hundreds of swift and
white-tailed fishermen from New Eng-
land and the provinces manned by
hardy and adventurous crews, are re-
presented this year by about ten vessels,
and they catching comparatively few
fish. What has happened to the fish?
They have been caught in other years,
have been destroyed by the purple seine.
There are plenty of hake of a good
quality on the south side, but no bait to
be caught.
