Any number of horses owned or trained in the same stable, may
start in the same class. National Trotting Association Rules to
govern except, where they conflict with the above conditions.

No intoxicating liquors, or intoxicated persons will be allowed
on or near the grounds. Hot dinners will be served on the grounds,
and will be under the same management as on former years, which
