Stock Markets At A Glance

TORONTO, Sept. 17 (CP)— Index losses were recorded for all groups at the close of the Toronto Stock Exchange today. Closing sales were 830,000.

CHICAGO, Sept. 17 (AP)— The weak New York Stock Market and growing labor trouble on the industrial front curbed demand in wheat futures today and prices slumped fractionally.

NEW YORK, Sept. 17 (AP)— Scattered rallies and industrials negotiated modest recoveries in today's Stock Market. Transfers totalled 300,000 shares, smallest for 2 full stretch since Aug. 30, against 1,020,000 Friday. The Associated Press 90-stock average was off 2 1/2 points at 87.9, a drop of 1 1/2 points in three successive sessions.

WINNIPEG, Sept. 17 (CP)— British buyers returned to the export market in Winnipeg grain exchange today, taking 3,000 bushels of wheat, and 500,000 bushels in the form of flour, to boost total purchases in the last two trading days to close to 15,000,000 bushels.

MONTREAL, Sept. 17 (CP)— Easter trends took all pivotal groups into lower ground on average in trading on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market as a technical correction which first manifested itself on Friday continued today. In places stocks cancelled recessions or worked up a bit from their lows. Volume was light. Trading box score: Total sales, 73,000 shares; industrials, 38,400; mines, 35,600; stocks higher, 31; lower, 68; unchanged, 57.
