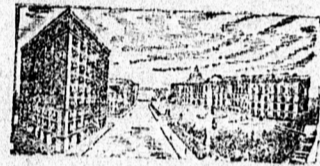

THE NORTHUMBERLAND.—The Pictou boat, the Northumberland, arrived in Charlottetown Saturday night at twenty minutes past eight o'clock.

OFF TO THE CIRCUS.—By the Northumberland Saturday morning a number of people from Charlottetown crossed to Pictou in order to attend the performance of Howe's Circus troupe that are now playing there. About thirty made the trip, returning in the evening. It may be stated that the circus is not coming over to Charlottetown as originally expected.

CORNWALL FOR HALIFAX.—A dispatch from England states that H. M. S. Cornwall will leave Plymouth for Hawke Bay as soon as the naval manoeuvres in home waters have been completed and the vessel has been refitted. She is due in Hare Bay on August 26th and will arrive at St. John's on September 6th. The ship will remain there ten days and will leave for Halifax on September 16th.

PROHIBITION PROSECUTIONS.—There seems to be a good deal of ignorance outside of the city with regard to the existence of the new section of the Prohibition Act which forbids the giving of spirituous liquor to any person or treating of any persons therewith in public places, just as the sale of it is forbidden, and it has been brought to the notice of the authorities that on the trains recently there has been some infringement of the law in this respect. In fact, on Saturday, Mr. Shaw Stipendiary Magistrate for Queen's County, had before him two cases which had arisen out of such circumstances, the prosecutions being brought by Mr. Bolsner, Inspector under the Prohibition Act. In one case the prosecution was not pressed, the defendant bearing the costs of the proceedings, while in the other matter evidence was led and the case was dismissed. But, as stated, there seems to be some doubt as to the extent to which the law goes, and for the benefit of the public generally below is reproduced the new section of the Act to which reference is made, which is as follows: "And any person who shall on a ferry boat or any passenger railway car, in any railway station or on any street, lane, public highway or at any picnic or gathering, society gathering, horse race or any other public demonstration, offer for sale, dispose of or publicly give or cause to be given or to treat any other person or persons or who shall at any such place expose any intoxicating liquor or who shall give or cause to be given to any infant or minor within this Province, without the consent of the parent or guardian of such infant or minor, any intoxicating liquor shall be liable to a fine of not less than five dollars and not more than fifty dollars."

MORE FOX COMPANIES.—In the last issue of the Royal Gazette publication was made of the applications for letters patent for the incorporation of three more new fox companies, as follows: The Rega Black Silver Fox Co., Ltd., The Georgetown Silver Black Fox Co., Ltd., and The Equitable Maritime Black Fox Co., Ltd. The first named company is being formed in Summerside, and its proposed capital is \$240,000, divided into 2,400 shares of the value of \$100 each. The applicants for the formation of this company are: Alpheus W. Leard, of Summerside, dentist; John A. Smallman, of Summerside, Merchant; William K. McGowan, of Summerside, merchant; Edward G. Muttart, of Summerside, merchant; and John Silliker, of Wilmot, Prince County, Farmer, all of whom are to be the first or provisional directors of the said company, whose office is to be situated in Summerside. The proposed capital of the Georgetown Silver Black Fox Co., Ltd., is \$60,000, divided into six hundred shares of \$100 each, and as indicated by the name is organized purely by Georgetown people and its chief place of business is to be situated in Georgetown.
