THE EXPERIMENTAL FARM FOR PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND.

The new Experimental Farm near this city as projected, will cover about 65 acres, lying between the Mount Edward Road on the East, the Deblois Road on the north and the P. E. Island Railway on the west and south. It thus enjoys the advantage as a show place of being open to public view on all sides.

most suitable varieties for this Province. Tests will be made with ornamental and useful trees and shrubs and it may be that a nursery of desirable varieties will develop later. The farm will be intersected by driveways, giving every facility for all interested to inspect the operations being carried on and the experiments in progress.

The site is at present occupied by half a dozen different lots on which options have been obtained. The residence of Judge Fitzgerald, with adjoining grounds on the Mount Edward Road, covering about five acres, will be retained by him. The central part of the Farm, comprising nearly one half of the whole, is made up of the estate of the late Hon. J. C. Pope and known as Ravenwood.

Live stock will not be kept except the horses necessary for carrying on the work of cultivation. The official staff will include the Superintendent, a Foreman and such working men as may at different seasons be required. We believe the Experimental Farm will prove of great interest and value to the farmers of this Province.

It was hoped that this would have brought about a corresponding reduction in Atlantic cable rates. Now it is announced by the companies concerned that no reduction will be made.

gainst the wireless. It is a good deal like our three short haul rates in freight transportation. The wireless message crosses the Atlantic cheaply, but pays twice as much for land transportation at each end as the cable message pays. This makes out a strong case for an all-British cable and land service under government control across the Atlantic and Canada.

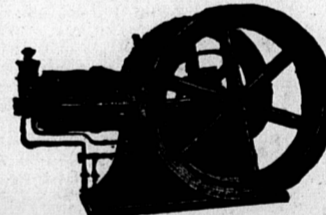
