GERMANS AND LILLE.

LONDON, Aug. 28.—A despatch to the Times from Boulogne says, it asserted that the German troops, presumably Cavalry, broke through the French lines near Arras, Province of Pas de Calais. The French moved up with rapidity, it is declared, and have the situation well in hand. A despatch says that the allied troops are being swiftly arranged to deal with any further attempt to break through the lines between Dunkirk and Lille.
