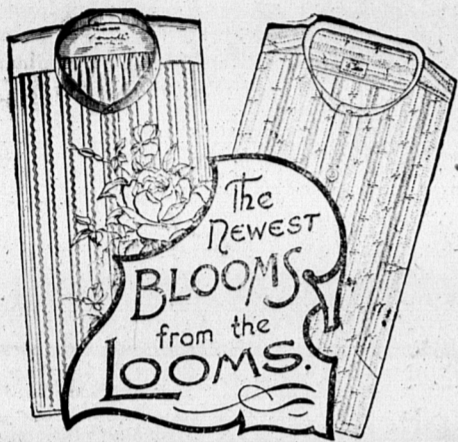

Mr. Byrnes retired from the police department in 1895, after more than thirty years of efficient service. After his retirement he had a private detective agency for a time, but soon he abandoned that business and retired into private life altogether, living quietly at his handsome home, with his wife and his two daughters. During his long career Mr. Byrnes accumulated a handsome fortune which he increased considerably by occasional "flashes" in Wall Street.

Although fifteen years have elapsed since Mr Byrnes retired from the metropolitan police department, the memory of his wonderfully efficient service is still fresh and stands out in bold contrast to the deplorable inefficiency of the police department at the present time. During Byrnes' regime he was so feared by the crooks, that many of them, who had been notorious, emigrated to other parts of the world; while at the present time the city is overrun with criminals of every kind and the police department seems helpless and absolutely unable to find any clue in scores of the most startling and heinous crimes.

Byrnes proved himself a man of exceptional energy, ability and determination. He never shrank from hard work and often worked on important cases for twenty-four hours in a stretch. His persistence was proverbial and he was never known to abandon a case until he had exhausted every resource and had sifted the clues to the very bottom. Although he had surrounded himself with the best detectives obtainable in the country, he never depended upon them altogether, but did most of the work himself.

It was under his regime that the so-called "dead-line" was drawn for the protection of the financial district in the lower part of the city and it was Byrnes who originated and used the "Third Degree" in the most effective manner to obtain confessions from suspected evil-doers. His methods were criticized by some persons as too severe and even inhuman, but there was never a complaint of efficiency or the slightest suspicion that he ever used his tremendous power and influence for the purpose of grafting. Mr. Byrnes was made superintendent of the entire police force in 1892 and filled that position ably and to his everlasting credit until he retired from the service in 1895.

The record of Mr Byrnes' work during the thirty years of his connection with the New York police department would make interesting reading matter. Many of the cases which he handled with consummate skill and in which he not only apprehended the perpetrators of the crime, but brought about their conviction and punishment, have become famous in the annals of crime. His work is full of surprises and never lacked in dramatic effects and picturesque settings. Many of his experiences and achievements have been utilized by fiction writers and authors of detective stories and have thus become familiar to a large circle of readers.

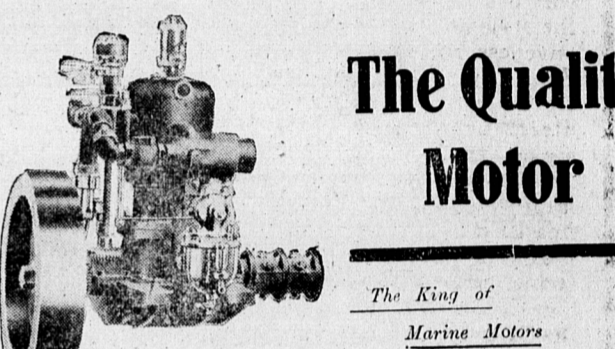
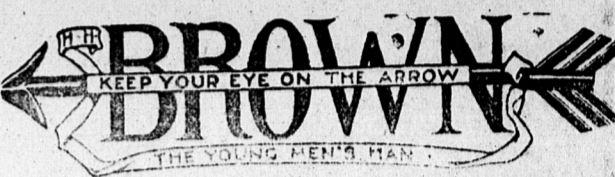

GAS EXPLOSION WRECKS CHURCH

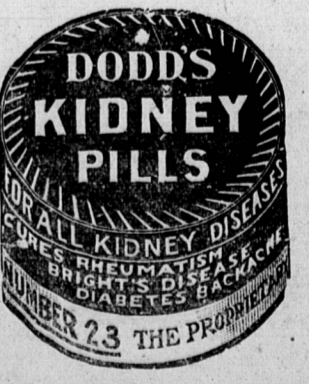

She ran up stairs and out on the street, but was seized and the flames extinguished. She is reported as recovering today. The damage to the church is about \$2,000.

MME CURIE MAKES GREAT DISCOVERY

BERLIN, February 19.—In an address at the Academy of Science recently Professor Lippman announced that Madame Curie has been successful in her research work in connection with polonium, an element described as five thousand times rarer than radium. She has succeeded in obtaining a tenth of a milligramme of the new element. She states that it possesses a radio-activity superior to radium. As against this, however, radium conserves its energy for an indefinite period, whereas polonium disappears rapidly.

TROUBLE IN ALBERTA

EDMONTON, Alta., Feb. 19.—The resignation of Hon Mr Cushing from the position of Commissioner of Public Works was recently announced and the correspondence has now been made public. He quits the Cabinet for the reason that he cannot conscientiously place his signature to a contract with the Alberta and Waterways Railway Co., by which the Government guaranteed bonds to \$20,000 mile with \$400,000 for terminals. He will make charges against the Government in the Legislature on Monday.
