LARGE BEQUESTS.

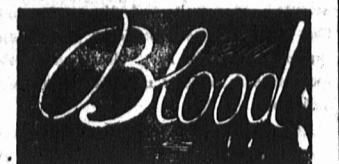

WINNIPEG, May 8.—The Assiniboia River is in flood and a portion of Brandon, Man., is under water. Only eighteen or twenty houses are affected, some being flooded to the second story and though the flood is said to be worse than any since 1882 no great danger is anticipated unless the water should rise more rapidly than at present.
