—C. S. Schurman, editor of St. Paul's Times, St. Paul, Minn., has presented the Baptist church in Summerside, with a handsome individual communion service, for a memorial to his parents John B. and Mrs. Schurman, deceased.

—This is the season when the New York and Boston markets are looking for frozen smelts and other frozen fish for their customers. It is leased from New York firms that smelt shipped from Prince Edward Island take two days in transit to New York and go by the Boston and Maine Railway. A delay is occasioned at Boston where a transfer of the articles from the cars must be made at considerable expense and very often they are exposed to soft weather. These express cars are heated and the smelts frequently arrive in a very bad condition. For this reason buyers claim to prefer shipments to be made in refrigerator cars if possible, which go by Montreal, and deliver the fish there in good marketable condition. These cars are transferred at Montreal on to the New York Central line, are run right down to the Fulton Market and there switched off to within a few yards of the warehouses and the dealers are allowed from one to two weeks if necessary to take delivery of the fish in instalments, as they are required for use. This latter appears the best way for shippers from this Province to look into the matter carefully before shipping their goods.
