S' Side Board Of Trade Meeting Largely Attended

The Summerside Board of Trade last night resumed their regular monthly meetings after the summer recess. The President Don Easter occupied the chair. A fair attendance of the members was recorded. The matter of nomination of Councillor and Vice President of the Canadian Chamber of Commerce was taken up and Mr. Easter, Summerside President, was nominated and the Board went on record as offering to support as Provincial Vice President the Charlottetown nominee. Mr. L. R. Allen, for the Town Improvement Committee, reported that the two dumps at the east end of the town had been somewhat improved since the last meeting. The President reported that he received a relative price of \$2300 from Morrison and McRae to pave the turn table in front of the station. John E. Campbell, for the Marine Committee reported that during the recent storm a portion of the sea wall at the marina had been torn away on the east side. The question of the oysters which were being flared in harbour engaged the attention of the members and it was agreed that some action should be taken as the quality of the oysters flared in very poor and would prove to be harmful to the industry. It was noted that the recommendations made by the Post Office had been effective and changes in his set-up were now being made to improve conditions. Mr. L. R. Allen gave the Board some very interesting figures regarding the oyster industry. He believed that in spite of the fact that there was no place in Canada where the oyster was as high as in Summerside that the town would meet its objective.
