WILL PROBATED.—Among the wills recently entered for Probate is that of the late Mr. Theophilus Moore, Charlottetown. The estate which consists of dwelling house on Upper Prince Street, security bonds of different stocks, mortgages, insurance, etc. is valued at \$15,450. One hundred and seventy-five dollars is bequeathed to different church societies. All the rest of the real and personal estate is bequeathed to Mrs. Mary H. Moore, wife of the deceased, during the term of her life. After her death all the Estate is to be sold and divided as follows:—Bethel M. E. Moore, daughter of the deceased, \$5000. The balance to be divided in five equal shares between Dr. Edwin P. Moore, William G. Moore, sons of the deceased and S. A. Douse, daughter of the deceased. The other two fifths is to be divided, share and share alike, between the children of his deceased daughter, Evelyn Smith, and his late son Dr. G. E. F. Moore, Mr. E. P. Moore and Col. F. B. Moore are executors.

NEW RAILWAY STATION.—One of the best evidences of the growing prosperity of the island is to be found in the fact of the building of a new railway station at O'Leary, Prince County. 
