Exhibition time will soon be here. From now on the days will speed by very quickly and almost before we realize it the great big event which interests every section of our Province is with us.

This year's Prize List is being circulated and if you have not secured your copy, please write at once and one will be mailed to you. It is a Prize List that we are proud of, because it has been carefully scanned from beginning to end, weak spots have been strengthened and new competitions made.

About \$1,000 has been added in prize money, making the total offering from cover to cover upwards of \$11,000 in prizes and premiums. There is something in this Prize List that will bring out the competitive spirit in almost every one of our people—farmer, florist, craftsman, artist and manufacturer. Every department has been thoroughly reviewed and brought up to the minute.

SPECIAL TROPHIES FOR EXHIBITORS OF REGISTERED LIVE STOCK

In order to encourage the breeders of Live Stock, and to permit them to have tangible evidence of superiority in the Show Ring, this Association will award the following four Trophies:—

For the Exhibitor scoring the most points for entries with registered horses.

For the Exhibitor scoring the most points for entries with registered cattle, Dairy Breeds.

For the Exhibitor scoring the most points for entries with registered cattle, Beef Breeds.

For the Exhibitors scoring most points in the Sheep and Swine Classes.

Awards will be made as follows:—1st Prize 5 points; 2nd Prize 3 points; 3rd Prize 2 points; 4th Prize 1 point. In case of Ties the 5th Prizes will count as 1-2 point each.

In order to encourage the cultivation of beautiful flowers and the improvement of homes by beautification through gardens and plants, His Honor Lt-Governor George D. DeBlois has generously contributed the sum of one hundred dollars, to be expended in prizes for Special Floral Displays at this Exhibition. This competition is open to amateurs and professionals.

Each Exhibitor will be allowed table space not exceeding 3 ft by 6 ft. The Competitor may show not less than 6 and not more than 10 kinds of Flowers. More than one, but not more than three containers of any one kind may be shown.

In view of the generous prizes offered the right is reserved to refuse to place entries below the desired standard of excellence.

1. For the Best Display by any individual residing in Charlottetown or within a radius of ten miles: 1st, \$10.00; 2nd, \$6.00; 3rd, \$4.00
2. For the Best Display exhibited by any resident of Queen's County other than Section 1: 1st, \$10.00; 2nd, \$6.00; 3rd, \$4.00.
3. For the Best Display exhibited by any resident of Prince County: 1st, \$10.00; 2nd, \$6.00; 3rd, \$4.00.
4. For the Best Display exhibited by any resident of King's County: 1st, \$10.00; 2nd, \$6.00; 3rd, \$4.00.
5. Grand Champion award for the Best Display in above classes: \$15.00.
6. Reserve Championship: \$5.00.

ONE HUNDRED DOLLAR PRIZE LIST FOR WOMEN'S INSTITUTE COMPETITION

In order to encourage competition between the various districts of Prince Edward Island, and to secure the interest of the Women's Institutes in the Provincial Exhibition, we are offering the following awards based on the number of points secured by Exhibitors in the four sections of the Province as given below.

A First Prize in any competition, either Live Stock, Flowers, Fruit, Dairy Products, Art or Handcraft by any individual will count five points for the Institute District in which he or she resides; 2nd Prize will count 3 points; 3rd Prize 2 points; 4th Prize one point. In case of ties a 5th Prize will count 1-2 point.

Each entry form carries a space where the name and number of the Institute in which the Exhibitor resides must be filled in.

CLASS 68

1. Institute Districts within fifteen miles of Charlottetown: 1st, \$10.00; 2nd, \$6.00; 3rd, \$4.00.
2. Institute Districts other than the above in Queen's County: 1st, \$10.00; 2nd, \$6.00; 3rd, \$4.00.
3. Institute Districts in Prince County: 1st, \$10.00; 2nd, \$6.00; 3rd, \$4.00.
4. Institute Districts in King's County: 1st, \$10.00; 2nd, \$6.00; 3rd, \$4.00.
5. Grand Championship for Institute scoring most points at Provincial Exhibition: \$15.00.
5. Reserve Championship: \$5.00.

EQUALIZATION OF FREIGHT

On all Live Stock owned on Prince Edward Island entered for competition and coming to the Exhibition from any point on Prince Edward Island beyond ten miles of Charlottetown, on the Prince Edward Island Railway, the Exhibition Association will refund to the Exhibitor all freight charges, providing that the entire exhibit by any such Exhibitor be returned to the point of shipment on the Prince Edward Island Railway. Live Stock transportation by truck will receive the same freight allowance as if transported by rail. The rate allowed by truck will be based on the minimum car freight rates for same distance by rail.

The above brief summary of our Prize List gives you an idea of the many and varied competitions which will take place at our Fair this year. If you have not been a competitor in the past we hope that you or one of your family will be with us this year. A Province and its people is judged by its progress in agriculture, stock raising and the arts. Let us continue to keep this, our beautiful Island home, to the front by improving ourselves and exhibiting to others these improvements so that they too, may learn from us a better way of doing things.
