WRONG SIDE'S RIGHT

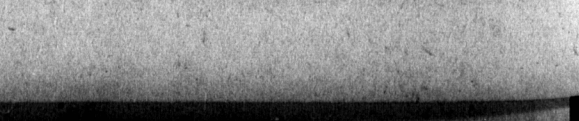
