THE DEBATE ON THE ADDRESS.

The debate on the address which will be resumed today has been in the nature of things quite one-sided so far as the number of speakers in the opposing parties is concerned, but otherwise of interest because of the number of new members who have taken part so far. There are fourteen new members in all, if we include Prof. McPhail, who puts forward an undisputed claim to having been for fifteen days a member of the former House. It may be thought risky to put so much new wine into an old bottle, especially in a prohibitory land like ours.

Be that as it may the new members who have so far spoken have given a good account of themselves. Their speeches have been concise, argumentative, practical for the most part, well-delivered and not too long. There are others of the new members yet to be heard from whose reputation for debating power has preceded their entrance to the Assembly. These with the considerable number of able men who are familiar with the legislative arena, go to make up a House that promises to be fully the equal of any that has preceded it in recent years.

There is this to be noted in the discussion so far as it has gone, that the tone has been distinctly

optimistic. From the Ministerial, Opposition and Independent benches alike the speakers have reflected a bright vision of the future for Prince Edward Island. In past sessions there was constantly recurring animadversion between opposing parties as to which was most to blame for the misfortunes and disabilities of the Province. Now there is a brisk if unequal rivalry in claiming credit for the good things that have come our way, with more to follow. This is one of the strong indications that hope has taken the place of despondency and gloom in the discussion of provincial affairs.

And this is reflected in the feelings of the people throughout the Province. They see that things have begun to come our way, that the tide of adverse circumstances which had so long and so strongly set against the Eastern Provinces is now turned in our favor and that we are coming into our own. The debate on the address and the official statements therein as to our improved financial position have already made it clear that whether long or short the session of 1912 will be memorable in the annals of the Province for years to come as marking the dividing line between a period of comparative stagnation and one of brighter prospects and more rapid progress.

THE SUBSIDY BILL PASSED.

Hansard of March 26 gives the speeches made in Parliament on the second reading of the bill to grant \$100,000 additional subsidy to Prince Edward Island. These include an exceedingly able presentation of the case for Prince Edward Island by Mr. McDonald, the Finance Minister, with frequent hostile interruptions by Mr. McDonald, the Liberal representative for Pictou; a speech by Mr. Hughes of Kings supporting the grant, but criticising the grounds upon which it is based; followed by a speech from Mr. McLean of Queens, strongly supporting the bill and frequently interrupted by Mr. Hughes. He was followed by Mr. McDonald of Pictou in strong hostility to the bill. He said among other things that had he been in the House he could not have voted for the increased subsidy granted by Mr. Fielding. Mr. Nicholson in a clear and forcible maiden speech supported the bill and said he had never heard a better presentation of the case for Prince Edward Island, even from Sir Louis Davies or Senator Ferguson, than that made by Hon. Mr. White. Hon. Mr. Pugsley followed, closing the debate. He was not opposed to granting liberal aid to Prince Edward Island, but thought there should first be a conference of the Provinces and their claims considered all together. The bill was then reported, read a third time and passed. We shall make further reference to this important debate.

POWER FROM PEAT.

The latest weekly report of the Department of Trade and Commerce, Ottawa, contains an interesting account of the success attending the operation of a peat power plant in Portadown, Ireland. It is of interest here by way of showing how our extensive deposits of peat in this Province may yet be turned to account in similar fashion. At Portadown peat fuel has been in use since September last to operate a factory requiring 275 to 400 horse power.

THE NEW FEDERAL GRANTS.

The additional subsidy of \$100,000 a year of itself makes an addition of over one-third to the amount hitherto received from Ottawa, and is of itself equal to something more than one dollar per head of our small population. Besides we are to get our share of the million dollars voted this year by the federal Parliament in aid of the highways throughout the Dominion. An Ottawa despatch tells that our proportion works out a sum of \$13,059.70. It is expected that the road grant may be increased in future years, and if so we will share proportionately in the increase. Then there is the appropriation of half a million dollars for the encouragement of agriculture. Our share in this grant is set down at \$6,529.85. Thus the road and agricultural grants together come pretty close to \$20,000. And the federal provision for other public services is quite up to that of previous years. This means that for the future nearly \$120,000 more of federal public moneys will be expended yearly within this Pro-

vince than in the past. Under the policy of past years this money would all have gone to railways, public works and service on the mainland. This is new, good money. Besides which we are promised the Car Ferry, and have our oyster beds restored to us. More money in circulation, more employment for labor, and a stimulus to trade and industry must result from these grants and enterprises.

The Guardian learns with pleasure that inquiries are being made by a large manufacturing concern in another Province for information with a view to setting up a factory in or near this city. We hope to hear of many such in the good time coming when the splendid opportunities here for new industries become better known.

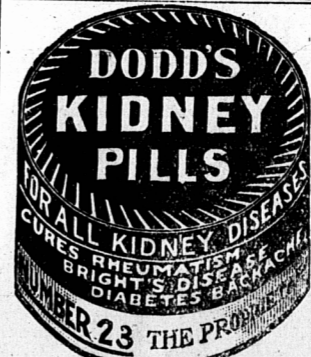

SHIP OWNERS SAID TO BE VICTIMIZED.

PHILADELPHIA, March 28.—Accused of swindling ship owners in this country and England of more than half a million dollars, J. Burton Scott, J. Merrill Stuart, Evan Powell and Fred M. Clark were arrested here by postal inspectors in a raid on the offices of J. Burton Scott & Co. According to Chief Inspector Cortelyou, the men falsely represented that they were connected with Lloyds in England and by offering marine insurance at greatly reduced rates succeeded in victimizing many ship owners. Inspector Cortelyou, says that the name of Morgan, Lyons, Clark & Co., was also used and that any victims believed that the firm of Morgan, Lyon & Co. was meant. At a hearing before U. S. Commissioner Craig, Scott was held in \$7,500 bail; Stuart in \$2,500, and Powell and Clark under \$1,000 each.
