A VERY SAD CASE.

Huddled up behind a sheltering nook of the Scotia Pier, North Sydney, where the bridge crosses Commercial Street, a rather good looking young woman was found near midnight Thursday and given shelter in the police station. Officer McAskill was unable to procure accommodation elsewhere, as all boarding houses were closed. To the police the unfortunate told a tale of sadness. Her name, she said, was Sadie Hall, and at the age of six years she was taken from the Home in Halifax by a man named McLeod, who took her to his home in Charlottetown, P. E. I. About a year ago her foster father died, when the girl went to a house on Water Street. Here she met a young man for whom she took a deep liking to, and as their affection seemed to be mutual they kept company until a short time ago, when, discovering he had brought about the girl's ruin, he left the Island capital. For a time the unfortunate girl gave up to bitter grief, but learning from a friend that her faithless paramour had come to Cape Breton, she gathered sufficient funds to pay her passage to North Sydney. After a two days' fruitless search for her betrayer the girl found herself without sufficient funds to even procure a night's lodging, and giving up what seemed to her the inevitable she threw herself down alongside the big pier at midnight Thursday, heart-broken and totally oblivious to the danger of falling a victim to the bitter cold. Saturday the girl was sent to one of the charitable institutions in Sydney, and in the meantime an effort is being made to locate the heartless cause of all the trouble.

CAMBRIDGE BANK LOOTED.

BOSTON, Feb. 24.—Following the discovery that the National Bank of Cambridge had been looted of \$144,000, the doors of the institution were closed by the Comptroller of Currency. A warrant has been issued for the arrest of George Coleman, the young book-keeper of the bank, who was last heard from in Kansas, a few days ago. Coleman is charged with embezzling the funds of the bank. The institution is insolvent. The capital of \$100,000 and the surplus is wiped out by the defaulters.

FIGHTING IN NICARAGUA.

MANAGUA, Feb. 24.—Another victory over the Revolutionists is announced by General Toledo, Nicaraguan Minister of War. The announcement is based on an official despatch from General Rivas, in command of the Government forces, who engaged the revolutionists under General Chamorro at Tisma. The losses are estimated at four hundred killed or wounded. A detachment of Government troops was taken prisoners but later on their rescue was effected.

NAVAL DEBATE LONG DRAWN OUT.

OTTAWA, Feb. 23.—The Canadian commons are still talking navy and the debate is likely to be prolonged, as many speakers are yet to be heard. The debate on the naval bill was resumed by Mr Warburton, of Prince Edward Island. He referred to the National Anthem incident of the first day's debate and contrasted it with the forged telegram which had resulted in the defeat of Hon. Mr. Templeman. He said it appeared the honorable course would have been for Mr. Borden to have recognized that the seat was gained through fraud and to have declined to allow it to be occupied by the Conservative member, who owed his election to such questionable tactics. Mr Warburton approved of the system of naval training which is to be established and was confident Canadians would be shortly turned out trained well enough to take places in the British navy. He agreed with Colonel McLean that the cruisers which were to be built by Canada would be able to guard and protect commerce through the four Atlantic approaches against German scouting cruisers and that Germany could not send more formidable craft, because the heavier vessels were designed with small coal capacity and because they would be needed at home in time of trouble.

Mr Cowan, of Vancouver, declared that Sir Wilfrid Laurier had implanted in his breast the seed not only of separation from Britain but of independence. "Why not," said Mr Cowan, "close now forever the gate that leads to separatism?" He declared against the provision in the bill requiring an order-in-council to authorize the Canadian navy to join with the British navy in case of war.
