Interesting Items.

An Illinois weekly paper has begun the publication of the entire Bible as a serial. It will take about fifty years to complete the publication.
The Chesley (Ont.) "Enterprise" says that a woman who was driving near the railway track at Edengrove, lost control of the horse, which made straight for the crossing. The animal's nose was just over the first rail when the train whizzed past, "taking the horse's head off as clean as a whistle." No other injury was done.

The manufacture of paper milk-bottles will soon be begun by the North Adams Paper Box Company. The process was invented by a Burlington, Vt., man, and the bottles will be made exclusively in North Adams, Mass. The bottles are water-proof and air-tight, and can be made so cheap that they can be thrown away after using once.

As a sequel to the tragic death of Baron George von Bleichroeder, the well-known banker, through an automobile accident the other day near Cologne, Emperor William has informed the burgomaster of Weisbaden that he considers the automobile a serious menace to public safety, and that he favors most stringent control of that method of locomotion. The Emperor is said to have added that men have no right to endanger human or animal life in the name of sport. The Kaiser owns several motors, but rarely uses them, although he has approved their adoption by the army.

The famous Humbert safe passed along the boulevards of Paris, recently, and attracted considerable attention. It was removed from the Hotel Drouot on a dray drawn by three horses, adorned with flowers, ribbons and bells, and was conveyed to the residence of its purchaser. A large band of calico stretched over the vehicle bore the inscription, "This is the one-hundred-million-franc safe." The men in charge did not appear to be in a great hurry, and made frequent halts at taverns, while an admiring crowd surrounded the dray. Perhaps they had been instructed to make the best possible use of the opportunity offered for cheap advertisement.

D. G. Longworth of the Cairo "Sphinx" declares that the famous Egyptian Sphinx is rapidly decaying. This is said to be the result of the altering climate of Egypt, due to the irrigation of recent years. Heretofore, an hour's downfall of rain once a year was a novelty in Egypt. The natives regarded it as some dire message of reproach from the gods. The irrigation and the many trees about the Delta, however, have changed this now every year on the head of the Sphinx. The severe "khamsheen" sand-storm follows and cuts into the sodden limestone of the ancient monument, whitening it away all over the surface.

Frank Reilly was the victim of a curious accident at Port Costa, Cal., recently. He was standing near a switch to a siding on which freight trains generally wait for the passenger trains to pass. He saw a young lady walking on the siding, and, believing her to be in danger, gestured vehemently to cause her to step from the oncoming freight train, motioned back to him that he was in danger. As the train came nearer both became the more earnest in their shouting and gesticulating, while neither thought of stepping off the tracks. Reilly proved to be in the wrong. The freight, instead of taking the siding, went straight through. While he was still trying to cause the young lady to get out of the way of supposed danger, the train struck him from behind, hurling him from the track and breaking his right arm in two places, badly cutting his head and bruising his side. He will recover.

Theory of an Old Angler.

Nine out of ten fishermen believe that when trout will not bite they are already gorged with food; but this is not the case. Even during the off days of the trout, one will be caught now and then, but always on bait, and if the angler could see the fish when it takes the bait he would notice that it does it in a very perturbed manner. The trout does not move out of its way in doing it, but mechanically takes the bait in much after the fashion of the sucker.
Then, if the trout fisherman who makes a catch at such a time will open the trout and examine its stomach he will be surprised to find that instead of the fish being gorged with food, and hence indifferent to more, its stomach has not a trace of food in it.
This will be found to be the case invariably, and disposes of the belief that when trout refuse to bite it is because they are already full of food. It would naturally be supposed that the best time to catch trout would be when they are hungry, but it will be found that when they are rising best to the fly, or are taking bait with the most avidity, there is plenty of food in their stomachs, frequently so much, in fact, that it would seem impossible that any more could be taken in.
Why this should be no one can tell. It is a fact, nevertheless, which any fisherman may easily verify by investigation.
