THE COOK'S CORNER

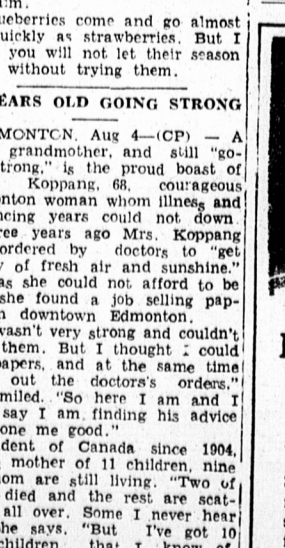
