—WELL KNOWN RESIDENT DEAD—The death occurred at his home in Egmont Bay on Tuesday after a brief illness of pneumonia of Mr. Joseph LeClair, age 70 years. Besides a sorrowing wife he leaves to mourn six children. The funeral took place Tuesday and was very largely attended.

—BRITISH WAR RELIEF meeting at Central Bedeque, on Monday Nov. 29th Judge Hazard of Charlottetown addressed a meeting in the interests of the suffering children in Europe. He stated there were 11,000,000 children at present with no means of support except charity, and that 8,000 cases of typhoid fever were reported in 1919 and this number would be doubled in 1920 as there was only one doctor to every 150 persons. In closing he made a very strong appeal for help from the citizens of Bedeque. Mr. Neil McLeod also spoke emphasizing the necessity of immediate action in the matter. On motion, it was decided to organize for a drive in Bedeque and vicinity. The following Committee was unanimously appointed by the meeting: David Schurman, Chairman; Everett Phillips, Sec'y Treasures, Collectors, Central Bedeque; Howard Schurman, John Bell, Mary McCarvill; Centreville: Daniel Noonan and Artemus Schurman; Lower Bedeque (William Stavert and Wm. Montgomery; Fernwood: Harrison McFarlane and Basil Sherry, Chelton: Roy Campbell and Fred McCardill; Middleton: Colin Craig, James McCordie; Searletown: Stuart Affleck, Arthur Green; North Bedeque: Jas. Clark, D. B. McDonald. The meeting closed with the National Anthem. Rev. C. A. Brittin, Chairman, C. J. Inman Secretary.
