John Mollison presided in a most acceptable manner. Short addresses were delivered by Mayor Morrison, N. McFarlane, L. U. Fowler (Bedoune), R. H. McDonald, Levi Siliphant, John D. Goss and Capt. Jos. Read. All the speakers regretted the fact that Dr. McDonald who had for many years been prominent in Court Chautauque had decided to leave the town and Province. For Mrs. McDonald, who was a charter member of Court Fortuna and financial secretary for six years, many nice things were said. All regretted the loss that both Courts in Summerside would sustain in the departure of two who had endeared themselves to all the fraternity. Dr. McDonald briefly replied, thanking the brethren for their kindness, and hoped that if their expectations were realized in a financial way to return to P. E. Island and thus keep up the friendship. Fred. McSween, Misses Compton and Hinton favored the assembly with some choice songs. Ice cream and cake were served at the conclusion of the program by the Companions and it was eleven o'clock when the last one said good-bye to the doctor and wife. They left for Calgary on the 27th.

REVOLUTION STARTS IN CUBA.

HAVANA, July 27—Senor Pasalods, secretary to President Gomez, tonight issued the following official statement regarding the occurrences in Oriente Province, which are believed to be the beginning of a wide spread revolutionary movement. "The government only knows that General Miniet and twelve men took the field in insurrection from an unknown cause yesterday in the vicinity of El Caney. They have now taken refuge in a difficult hill country where they are being hotly pursued by the forces of the rural guard and by infantry from the garrison in the city of Santiago. Nothing is known of any other uprising."

Col. Jane another revolutionary veteran who was reported to have taken to the woods at the head of a numerous following. It is stated, left Santiago in a sail boat on Sunday. Since then he has not been seen. The government has no knowledge that he has any connection with the movement, his friends asserting that he is merely on a fishing.

Senor Pasalods said that the government had no information of the rumored engagement between the rural guards and Miniet's band, in which an aide of the latter was reported killed, and he had every confidence that the government forces would soon run down the insurgents. Rumors that General Jesus Babi, General Mate Alencal, president of the Veteran's Association, Luis Perez, the former governor of Pinar del Rio province, had joined the insurgents, were disproven by messages sent by these men themselves, assuring the government of their loyalty.

TO TEST THE RIGHTS OF DOGS ON HIGHWAYS.

HALIFAX, N. S., July 27—The rights of dogs on the public highways will be tested by an action brought by Judge Meagher, of the supreme court. The judge had a favorite dog which was run over and killed by an auto near the city and he is suing for \$100 damages. The accident happened on the Bedford Road, and the action is brought against the Bishop Brothers of Caning the owners of the car.

COOLER IN NEW YORK.

NEW YORK, July 27—With less humidity and more breeze, New York did not suffer greatly with the heat today, although the mercury reached a maximum of 86 at 2.30 o'clock this afternoon. Seven deaths occurred during the day, as against fifteen yesterday.

ANOTHER REVOLUTION IN HONDURAS.

MOBILE, Ala., July 27—According to information brought here on the Bobo, sympathizers of Gen. Bonilla, the barrack of the Honduran Government at Puerto Cortez, Gen. Moren, the leader of the revolutionists and the commander of the barracks, were killed. The passengers report that martial law has been declared. Law has been declared.

K. S. SCOTT GOES TO LONDON.

OTTAWA, July 27—K. S. Scott, for many years financial editor of the Toronto Globe and special agent of the customs department of Canada in New York for ten years or so, has been transferred to London, England, where he will act as special agent for the United Kingdom and the continent of Europe. Such a step was foreshadowed by Hon. William Paterson in the house of commons last session, in order to meet the complaints of Canadian manufacturers and importers that the law as to importations under the British preferential tariff was being violated by European firms, who shipped goods to Canada as of whole, British manufacture, while as a matter of fact they had been merely made up in England. Mr. Scott is replaced in New York by H. J. Gould, who has been investigating officer at Chicago by Fred Norris, a member of the staff of the chief inspector.

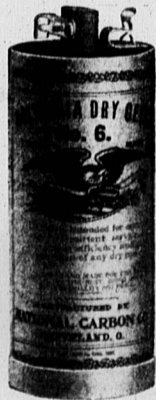

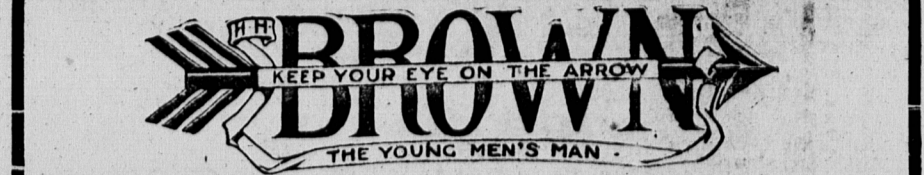
