AN IMPORTANT ISLAND

Although the Island of Cuba has been the centre of great interest during the past few months its real importance is not generally realized. Rich in mineral deposits and agricultural resources, with a great wealth of primeval forest and many natural conditions favorable to health and comfort, Cuba is a prize which any nation might be pardoned for coveting.

Bituminous coal, manganese, iron and copper were once worked with profit by foreign corporations. These companies ultimately withdrew their capital, but this was long before the mines were exhausted. In addition to the mineral wealth it is estimated that under proper conditions Cuba could produce easily from \$55,000,000 to \$60,000,000 worth of tobacco every year, fruit to the value of \$25,000,000, and hides, wool and other commodities could be made to yield at least \$25,000,000 more. The staple exports of Cuba have been heretofore tobacco and sugar, but the possibilities of fruit culture are almost unlimited. And the coast cities of the north Atlantic would form a ready market for these products. The soil of Cuba is rich beyond compare and admirably adapted for growing nearly every species of tropical fruit.

The forests, too, could be made a source of millions of revenue. About 14,000,000 acres are exceedingly rich in precious woods, including mahogany, ebony, etc., besides other varieties valuable for fine cabinet work, ship-building etc.

It is believed that with proper sanitary conditions this hither-to fever-smitten island might be converted into a healthful resort with the germs of yellow fever permanently stamped out. The mean average temperature is 77 to 80 degrees; the total average range 58 to about 90 or 92. In July and August the average is 82, December and January 72.

As regards population the official census of 1887 gives the following figures:—Total population in round numbers, 1,600,000, classified as follows: Black and mulattoes born in Cuba, 500,000; natives of Spain and the Canary Islands and adjacent islands, 180,000; white native Cubans, 920,000. In no province do the blacks and mulattoes outnumber the whites. Many seem to think that blacks and mulattoes make up a majority portion of all Cuba, but this is not at all the case. But it is believed that the devastation caused among the people by the savage methods of warfare has reduced this population by about 300,000. Under above conditions and with a sound government and a good educational system, the prediction may not be greatly overdrawn that ere many years elapse Cuba could be made not only "the gem of the Antilles, but the gem of all the oceans."

EDITORIAL NOTES.

The present progressive condition of Toronto and the readiness with which money is being invested in its industries is attracting general attention throughout the Dominion. This season's factory extension in that city will cost not less than \$300,000. The Massey Harris Company will expend about \$250,000 on their works in Toronto and Brantford, the Allan Manufacturing Company about \$30,000, the new pork packing establishment \$60,000 and several other companies from \$10,000 to \$50,000 each. It is believed that the extensions of existing establishments and the erection of new factories will furnish work for not less than 2130 additional employes.

The Philippine Islands lying south of China contain about 100,000 square miles. The population is estimated as high as 10,000,000. The cold season lasts from November to March, the hot season from March to June and the rainy season from June to November. The natural resources, though rich, are still largely undeveloped. Tobacco, hemp, sugar cane, coffee and cocoa are produced in large quantities. In 1896, before the insurrection, the exports to Germany were valued at \$233,700, to Spain \$4,500,000, to the United States nearly \$5,000,000, to Great Britain \$7,467,500, to Japan \$1,387,000. In the same period the imports into the Philippines from Germany were valued at \$744,928. From Spain \$7,700,000 owing to the protectionist tariff and high differential flag duties; from France \$1,795,000, from Great Britain \$2,467,000, and from the United States only \$272,240. The Germans in the Philippine Islands are chiefly shopkeepers, bankers and commission agents.
