WE BELIEVE THEY WILL FARE BETTER UNDER NEW PREMIER.

ODESSA, Dec. 4—It is the opinion of prominent Jews here that M. Kocovtseff, the new premier, will either reverse or very greatly moderate his predecessor's anti-semitic scheme for the Russification of Jewish industries in a Southern Russia. M. Stolypin's project included the absolute exclusion of Jews from the great staple trade of grain exports, and the prohibition of Jewish or Russian banks financing the merchants and shippers.

MEXICO'S RULER IN AEROPLANE FLIGHT

MEXICO CITY, via Galveston, Texas, Dec. 2—President Madero in the passenger carrying aeroplane of Geo. M. Dyott, took a four minute flight this afternoon, being the first Chief Executive of any nation in the world's history to ascend in an aeroplane.

LONDON PHYSICIAN TO SEEK CURE IN CANADA

TORONTO, Dec. 4 Dr. F. S. Pepperden, a distinguished London physician who had considerable to do with the perfection of Roentgen's discovery of the X-ray will pass the winter at Vineland in the Niagara district, in a series of experiments, whereby he hopes to save his right hand, which is afflicted with the hitherto incurable disease of dermatitis, caused by X-ray burns received in the course of his studies.

CHARGED WITH RESTRAINT OF TRADE

CINCINNATI, Dec. 4—Suit was filed in the United States Circuit Court late today, against the National Cash Register Co., of Dayton, O., charging that the Company is in a conspiracy in restraint of trade, and asking that it be enjoined from further carrying on such illegal practices as is set forth in the petition.

The Government does not seek to destroy the National Cash Register Company as a corporation, nor to interfere with the legal and legitimate business of the Company, but ask that it be prohibited from selling cash registers and other registering devices in a manner that would prevent competition. Those named as defendants are the Cash Register Company and 2 officers, directors and district sales agents of the company.

It is charged that the defendants have waged vicious, wrongful and unlawful war of extermination against other competitors and have driven them out of business, securing thereby about 35 per cent. of the cash register business.
