### ROME, Aug. 5 (Special).

A body of thirty American pilgrims, headed by Mr. J. H. Tihen, Bishop of Lincoln, Neb., called upon Cardinal Diomedeo Falconio, former Apostolic Delegate to the United States, who greeted them with great heartiness. He told them their call brought him agreeable recollections of the years he had spent in America. The pilgrims were afterward received by the Pope in Consistorial Hall, where Bishop Tihen delivered an address affirming the loyalty of American Catholics. The Pontiff expressed his pleasure at seeing the American pilgrims, who had made such a long journey. The pilgrims then presented their Peter's Pence and the Pope imparted the Apostolic benediction. ### ST. PETERSBURG, Aug. 5 (Special).

The Russian government has decided not to participate officially in the San Francisco exposition. Although the relations between the United States and Russia are less acute than they were when it was originally decided not to take part in the San Francisco Exposition, the government sees no reason to modify that decision. It is felt that it would be extremely awkward for Russia to be represented at San Francisco in the absence of a commercial treaty with the United States. Great Britain's decision not to exhibit is regarded as strengthening Russia's Act. The decision of the American Secretary of the Treasury not to permit the free entry into the United States of wood pulp paper from Russia has not yet become known here officially, and Russia's answer to the American government therefore has not been discussed.

### GROVE BEACH, Conn., Aug. 5 (Special).

A two masted schooner, bound east, sank off Duck Island Light opposite this town, during a storm yesterday afternoon. The three men comprising the crew were rescued by Captain Joe Smith, the lighthouse keeper, and are now on the Island. Owing to the unusually high sea it has been impossible to reach the island and ascertain further particulars. The schooner is said to be a total loss.

## ROYAL YEAST

### THE HAGUE, Aug. 5 (Special).

Dr. Kirk Bos, a liberal democratic member of the Chamber of Deputies, who for some time had been endeavoring to form a coalition Cabinet, has been relieved of the task by Queen Wilhelmina. Dr. Bos was unable to carry out the wishes of the Queen by reason of the fact that the socialists declined to accept portfolios in a coalition Ministry. The formation of a new Cabinet is made necessary by the resignation in June of Premier Theodoros Heemskerk and his Ministers, following the elections to the Second Chamber of the States General, the results of which left the coalition of parties supporting the Ministry without a majority in the Chamber.
