FATAL RAILWAY ACCIDENT.

INDIANAPOLIS, Nov. 28.—The passenger train on the Pennsylvania road which left here for Louisville, at 6.15 o'clock last evening, ran into an open switch at Safford station, six miles south of here. Engineer Frazer, of this city was instantly killed and firman Gant, of this city, was fatally injured. Baggage master Clayton, also of this city, was seriously injured. Three of the passengers were slightly injured. The engine crashed into a car loaded with stone on the siding and was wrecked.
