TO COOL A ROOM.

Cheap Device That is Said to Work Well.

(G. F. H. in New York Times.)

Procure a small zinc-lined tank holding from two to three gallons of ice and salt, and put in about half pint of ammonia. This tank can be placed in a corner of the room, occupying very little space, and a drip pan put under it to catch the water condensed by the heat of the room. This process of condensation is quite rapid, and will very quickly reduce temperature. The larger the room the larger the tank, and vice versa. The practicability of this scheme has been tested, and it is simple, clean, and inexpensive. The tank will have to be replenished but once a day, except when the weather is extremely warm.

There is one objection to this plan of cooling rooms on our hottest days, and that is we will be apt to feel the heat of the streets when we are obliged to go out, and are more likely to suffer from prostration or sunstroke. That is something for us to think of, especially old people, before we make the experiment. Of course, it is understood that these little tanks can be made no less ornamental than radiators, and take up very little space.

THE LATEST PANACEA

A physician of some note has just announced another panacea for all the ills humanity is heir to. It consists simply of sunshine. It must, however, fall upon the bare skin. Among the afflictions which it is said have been cured by this means are tubercular ulcerations, skin diseases, old cuts and sores and obesity. "An abdomen triple-plated with adipose tissue will melt like snow under the caresses of the sun," it is declared. "To take a sun bath," the doctor explains, "it suffices simply to stretch one's self completely unclad in the direct rays of the sun, taking care always to protect the head, and above all the back of the neck. There must be no intermediary between the skin and the sunlight, for the chemical power of the solar rays is completely nullified by clothing and by glass. The inclination of the rays is also important; when they fall perpendicularly their action is much greater; oblique rays glance, on the contrary, from the surface of the skin, and are without effect."

LEARN TO SWIM.

The time of the year has again come around when the newspapers are full of drowning accidents. We read of canoes upsetting, boats upsetting, men and women tumbling in the water, and being drowned, all the fatalities, almost without exception, being due to lack of knowledge how to swim. Just yesterday there was an account in the paper of two boys in the neighborhood of sixteen and seventeen years being drowned because neither could swim. Imagine boys of that age not being able to swim! Swimming is as easy as walking and every boy and girl should make a point of learning how. Few indeed are the people who have not some opportunity of learning. There is nearly always some time during the year.

The trouble about most persons is that they are horribly afraid of the water. They look upon it as some terrible and mysterious element that is longing to devour them. Once conquer this ridiculous dread and swimming comes easily. Speaking as an amateur I can say that once my dread of the water was overcome it became practically impossible for me to sink. And that was when I was a very little girl, ten at the most. Up to then I was afraid of the water, but once I realized that I had a weapon in my knowledge of swimming that kept me from danger I lost all fear and from that day on it seems impossible for me to sink. If only all fathers and mothers would bring up their children as sensibly! Teach the children to swim during the summer holidays and the knowledge thus acquired may not only save their own lives at some future time but save the lives of others. The actual art of swimming may not save them but in many cases the sense of being at home in the water does. If there is a boat accident the swimmer does not lose his head but is able to look about and see what had better be done. More lives are lost in all probability from sheer fright and panic when in the water than from lack of knowledge of swimming.

BRITISH LOCOMOTIVES.

(Cassier's Magazine.)

Efficiency and reliability are more to a locomotive superintendent than economy in fuel, and those who provide public facilities are wise not to take risks for the sake of small gains. Compounding means very high boiler pressure with accompanying boiler troubles, and its keenest advocates do not suggest its application to all locomotives. The four cylinder compound has worked well abroad, though it seems likely that some of its best work is done when running as a four-cylinder simple.

Compounding has now a strong competitor in superheating, a number of British railways being engaged at present in testing the claims made for it. Economy of fuel and water is certain in every case, but that does not sum up all the advantages of superior heating. The increase in volume due to the superheat, as compared with the same weight of saturated steam, demands larger cylinders for its economical use, while giving the same power as the non-super-heating engine. This, again, permits of a lower boiler pressure being used, say a reduction from 180 to 165 pounds, assuming that 20-inch cylinders were substituted for a superheater. This means a great saving in wear and tear of the boiler, of course, piston valves are imperative, and forced lubrication of the cylinders and valves practically a necessity. If the valves are of the inside admission type worked by a rocking shaft, the eccentric rods will be open to objection, one would expect that the locomotive fitted with a superheater, would require more skilled driving and attention as regards repairs. There is no doubt of the economic value of super-heating, but confidence in its practical application has still to make some headway among locomotive engineers.

FADS AND FASHIONS.

Afternoon gowns are more or less elaborate.

This season one finds entire coat and wraps of cretonne.

Hosiery matches ones bathing suit in color. Either the white or black slippers or shoes are worn; if the suit is trimmed with black, that is the color of footwear selected.

A band of insertion, or embroidery on a stitched band of the material, the dress is a neat finish to the square collarless neck of a wash dress, whether of gingham, chambray, or linen.

Very dainty are the coat collars of linen with the buttoned-shoulder scalloped edge. The collars with insets of baby Irish are especially attractive.

The Scotch plaid gingham were never more attractive than this year. For children's frocks and for gown for the girl in her teens they are unsurpassed.

Very attractive indeed are the coats of woolen poplin. While white is the favorite color, the material may be obtained in a wide range of colors.

The fashions that have proved acceptable for summer are the skirts with a deep band, the sleeve cut in one with bodice, and strong colors for gown and hats.

Among the new linens are those with the crepe effect and the wide diagonal stripes in self tones. Bas kett weaves, too, are as popular as they are effective.

White upper bodices are worn with blue, red, pink and apple green lined skirts, and ecru and bronze upper bodices are worn with brown, tan, and even black skirts.

Hatpins are provided with "prize-points" often as large and of value as the hatpin itself. Frequently they are the same as the head or correspond in design.

SEALED TENDERS addressed to the undersigned and marked on the envelope "Tender for Sewer," will be received at the office of the Commissioners of the Transcontinental Railway, Ottawa, Ontario, until twelve o'clock noon on the 20th day of July, 1910, for the excavation, construction and completion of a main sewer line for the Wapiti Range, E. on the line of the National Transcontinental Railway, about six miles east of Winnipeg, extending from the pump house and terminal yard to the Seine River.

Particular specification may be seen in the office of Mr. Gordon Grant, Chief Engineer of the Commissioners, at Ottawa, Ont., and in the office of Mr. S. R. Poulin, District Engineer, St. Boniface, Manitoba.

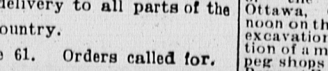
