A SPECIAL cable received from Biley gives details of the loss by Canada yesterday of the McKinnon Cup. It appears it was due to Vroom going to pieces at the 800 yards range. He only put on 16 points at this range, the next lowest Canadian score being 86. Vroom blames coaching. This is where the cup was lost, as had Vroom been in his usual form the difference of twenty points would have given Canada the cup by four points. Vroom shot well in the other stages of the match. The detailed score of the Canadians gives Capt Jones, Pownall third place on the team with 120 points. The highest was 122 points.

THE dental firm of Lodge & Wright have last week established in their Baltimore Dental Parlors in connection with their operating chair a patent compressed glass fountain cuspidor, the second of its kind imported to the Maritime Provinces. The cuspidor, which was manufactured in Pittsburgh, has waterworks and sewerage attachment, and when in use is kept clean by a constant stream of water which flows rapidly through the apparatus. Another attachment is the suction ejector used for extracting the saliva from the mouth while an operation is being performed. There is also a small tap with tumbler attached, from which may be drawn the sparkling fluid. The entire outfit detracts much from the disagreeable feeling usually attending the dentist's chair, and will doubtless be greatly appreciated by the many patrons of Drs. Lodge and Wright.

THE Orangemen of Clyde River and Kingston assembled in Clyde River Hall on Sunday, July 16th at 2 p. m. There they formed a procession nearly fifty strong, and marched to the Clyde River Presbyterian Church. Rev. A. F. Browne preached an eloquent sermon taking his text from Isaiah I, 19, "If ye be willing and obedient ye shall eat the good of the land." The large audience which filled the church to overflowing listened with rapt attention to the reverend speaker dwell on the bright future of the English speaking people, he also showed that "if Orangemen lived up to their professions they would be all right and charged them to hold firm to their principles of civility and religious liberty." The choir also furnished choice music. After service the procession returned with Mr. Browne in the lead and marched again to the hall where the hearty vote of thanks of the Orangemen present was tendered the reverend gentleman for his eloquent address. Mr. Browne replied in a few words thanking the brethren for their appreciation of his services, encouraging them in their grand and noble work and assuring them of his willingness to assist them at any time.

A Guardian representative and a number of other friends had the pleasure on Saturday evening of inspecting Dr. Warburton's new X ray apparatus. The machine is of the Toepfer-Holtz influence type, and combines in one the advantages of static and Faradic appliances for electro-medical treatment and the Ruhmkorff coil for X ray examinations and photographing. Outside of its advantages for medical work (and electricity is being more and more extensively applied in the healing art) the machine is a most interesting piece of mechanism. To the unlearned reader it may be observed that the X rays are not ordinary rays of light, but rays which appear to the eye of a greenish yellow color, not sufficiently strong to read by, but possessing the power to penetrate through the human body and clothing. In the experiments made the bones in the hands, arm and body of a subject were plainly visible and the internal organs could be seen and the beating of the heart quite distinctly observed. After photographing the hand of one of the company, the Crookes tube and fluoroscope were laid aside and in less time than it takes to write it the apparatus was converted into a static, when different members of the party were filled with electricity till their hair stood on end. Flashes of fire could be drawn from any portion of their anatomy. Another change and the machine became a Faradic battery giving an intermittent current from the mildest to well, no one cared to be electrocuted. The ozone attachment and other features were seen but not tested. The short series of experiments were most instructive as well as interesting.
