**BY-LAWS READY.**—The Guardian is in receipt of a copy of the Sheep Breeders' Association Act and the by-laws to which reference has already been made in this paper. This Association is now ready to issue sheep and it would be well for every farmer in the Province to take advantage of its generous terms. There are no salaries paid by the association for carrying on the work. The Government gives a generous grant towards it and if any funds return to the Treasury after compensation has been made for the sheep killed by dogs they will go to the advancing of sheep breeding in P. E. Island. The cost is trifling in comparison with the benefits that are to be received and the Department of Agriculture have arranged to bring this matter before the Public School Meetings. Every farmer who raises sheep should become a member of the Sheep Breeders' Association.
