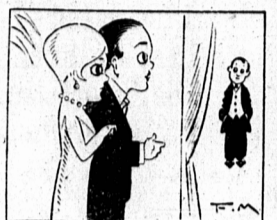

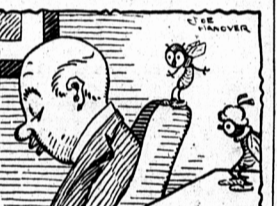

CANADA'S EMBLEM, THE MAPLE LEAF, IN DEMAND IN ENGLAND

OTTAWA, Oct. 12.—The Maple Leaf, Canada's emblem, is in demand in England. From the office of the Canadian High Commissioner in London comes a request for Canadians to send over maple leaves which may be used for decorative purposes at public dinners during the year. The High Commissioner receives numerous applications for maple leaves from organizations which wish to display the Canadian emblem, and now his supply is depleted. It is understood that the maple leaves, should be addressed to the High Commissioner's Office, Canadian Building, Trafalgar Square, London.

Race Of Pigmies Found By Scientists

(Canadian Press.)

WELTEVREIDEN, Java, Oct. 12.—Smiling and playing with bright beads which they had given her, a tiny pigmy girl recently led United States and Dutch scientists of the Stirling expedition into a village of pygmies in the jungles of Dutch New Guinea's mountains. She was the first of a newly discovered race of pygmies to be seen by white men.

For four months, the expedition had negotiated the dangerous rapids of Mamberamo River, had climbed the towering Van Rees Mountains and had braved deadly tropical fever in their quest of the pygmies for ethnological study. Their success in finding the dwarf people after other expeditions had been turned back with heavy loss due to disease, was largely achieved by use of an aeroplane which flew over swamps and dense equatorial growth.

Pigmy land was found after five days of climbing of steep mountains, which rose to a height of 35,000 feet. First the party came upon the Rouffar River, which plunged down a deep gorge, with high cliffs on both sides. Across the gorge was a rattan suspension bridge.

The party crossed gingerly, half suspecting treachery and prepared for a hostile reception they had been told to expect. Instead, they met the smiling little black girl. Following her they entered a village and soon were surrounded by the people of pygmic land. They were friendly. Smiling, and making signs of good will, they brought presents of their primitive bows and arrows, ornaments and other crude implements of the stone age development to which they belong. In return, they expressed their delight with the murine shells of trifling value which the men of the expedition gave them. The pygmies spoke in low tones, were unobtrusive, but not timid. Ages of immunity among the mountain heights from the fierce Papuans of the plains had made them calm and cool, unafraid.

The scientists were able to make careful measurements and determined they were of the type pygmy type. They studied them to fix their relationship to other negro tribes and to collect ethnological data for the United States National Museum in Washington, D.C.

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Ex-Kaiser Alone Hopes to Return

BERLIN, Oct. 12.—The former Kaiser is the only man in the world who seriously cherishes the hope that some day he will triumphantly re-enter Germany and re-establish himself on the throne from which he ruled for 30 years.

A high official of the Prussian government made this remark today to a correspondent of the Associated Press in connection with the Hohenzollern indemnity and property settlement agreement signed by the state and the former Emperor's administrators and now before the Diet.

The reading of the compromise bill relating to this settlement raised a great uproar in the Prussian Diet today, the Communists assuming a threatening attitude and denouncing the terms of the settlement, which provides for a payment to the Hohenzollern family of \$3,600,000, the allotment of 167,000 acres of the former estates and a castle at Homburg for the ex-Kaiser and his wife, Princess Hermine.

A bank which will take five years to complete, and in the construction of which tons of steel, concrete, and iron will be used, is now being erected in the "City." Next to the Bank of England, it will be the largest building of its kind in the world, says an "Old Country" paper.

The strong rooms, occupying two of the nine floors, are to have doors weighing seven tons each, and will require from four to six keys to open them. A special steel armor is to be used which, if attacked by an oxy-acetylene blow-lamp, will send out a shower of sparks of such magnitude that the burglar will be driven off.

A wonderful electrical apparatus is being installed which will operate a burglar alarm of quite a new kind. It sets ringing a great bell, which will resound all over the "City."

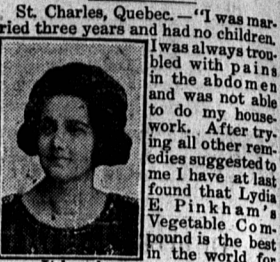

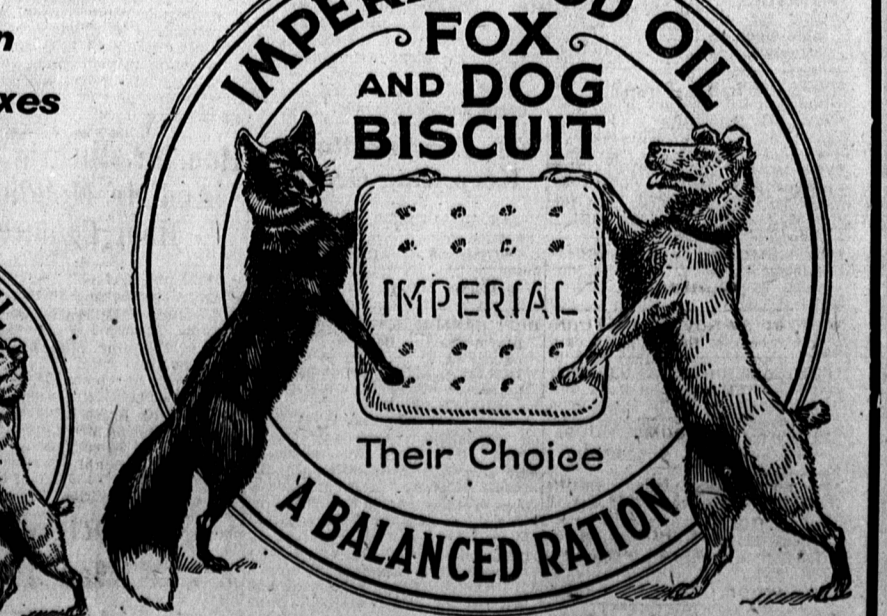
