POINTED SUGGESTIONS.

The problem of the presence of the foreigner is as old as it is perplexing. But the real danger lies in alien sympathies. What is meant by the "mixt multitude" spoken about in v. 4? Things got into a tangle through the spirit of murmuring which started among those who had little, if any, rights and who realized little, if any, responsibility. They were out for their own parasitic advantage.

A fault-finding spirit is as contagious as small-pox and just as offensive. There ought to be some way of placing the infected in quarantine until they are satisfied that what God provided for them is much to be preferred to anything that it is His will to withhold.

It is painful to notice how often and to what limits the patriotism of many will ooze where the nations come short of desire. And the study of the stimulation of desire is full of interest. Why did you wish to change your order at the restaurant after you saw what was on your neighbor's plate? The person who is nervously overwrought because his duties crowd him and his cares oppress him is to be pitied indeed. Such was Moses; and it is to be noticed that the Lord did not take his words or prayers at such a time at their face value. That was merciful, and it provides a copy for the mercy of others towards any who are in like manner afflicted.

strengthening of the hands of Moses by the appointment of men who should share his burden. That look fret from the heart of Moses and put the joy of a trust into the hearts of the appointees. That is the way to work all institutions that are worthy of being worked, namely, by the proper distribution of responsibility and labor.

What would happen, anyway, if all earnest prayers were answered as they were asked? Well, the lesson indicates something of what would happen. The psalmist paraphrases it in some such way as this: "The Lord gave them their request, but sent leanness into their souls." And how often gluttony stands for leanness of soul!

It must not be forgotten that the Lord was greatly displeased at the murmuring of the people for flesh, and at the anxiety which it caused Moses to exhibit in prayers and wishes that were unmanly and full of recrimination. God hears all murmurings. No complaints pass Him. And most of them are just as unreasonable as those of the Israelites who cried for flesh—like the groan for warm weather in January and for cool weather in July.

Dread of failure in a work or trust committed to his charge is a dread peculiar to the sensitive and honorable. It must not be yielded to further than to retain sensitiveness and honor, because these qualities, toned by faith, and courage and independence upon God, are necessary to success. The Lord did not drop Moses from leadership because he had fears that he would fail. More doubt is to be entertained of the leadership of one who has no doubt of himself.

Where spiritual gifts are in evidence among many there is no need for the envy of any. A spiritual gift stands for the profit of all.
