

STEEL TRUST SHOWS INCREASED EARNINGS.

NEW YORK, July 27—The quarterly statement of the United States Steel Corporation for three months ended June 30 last, issued today, shows total earnings of \$4,170,960, an amount far in excess of official estimates, and greater than the earnings of the first quarter by \$8,554,054. Net earnings for the quarter were \$3,880,755, or \$2,377,561 greater than the first quarter's return.

SECRETARY OF PUBLIC WORKS.

OTTAWA, July 27—Rodolphe Desroches, who for some years has been assistant secretary of the department of public works, is promoted to the position of secretary of the department, rendered vacant by the death of Napoleon Tessier. The appointment has just been announced. Mr. Desroches entered the service in 1902 and was made assistant secretary in 1906. For some months he has done the work.

LUKEMAN EQUALS RECORD.

TORONTO, July 25—In the Central Y. M. C. A. meeting at Scarborough Beach on Saturday afternoon Frank Lukeman, of Montreal, equalled the Canadian record by doing the hundred yards in 9.45 seconds. He also won the 200 yard sprint and the 120 yard hurdles.

THE BICYCLE.

BRUSSELS, July 25—Charles Parant, the French bicyclist and motor-paced champion of Europe, today won the 100 kilometres (sixty-two miles) world's professional championship, behind motorcycle, in 1.22.23.4.5. Eddy Walthour of Atlanta, was second. Nat Butler dropped out of the race.
