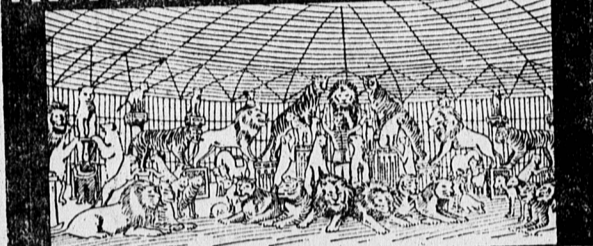

MEXICO CITY, June 29.—Courtesy is a common commodity in Mexico. No Mexican is too poor to afford it.

AIRSHIP BUILT TO BOMB NEW YORK DUE IN ENGLAND

LONDON, June 25.—The most wonderful airplane in the world, the Zeppelin L-71, built by the Germans to bomb New York, is about to arrive at Pulham, the British air station. She will be piloted to England by a mixed German and British crew. The airship has a flying radius of 12,000 miles, or more than three times the distance between London and New York. She is the largest airship in the world, the L-71 and Capt. Max Field, who is training a picked crew of American airmen in Yorkshire, will probably go to Germany to take charge of her.

TOMATO NESTS. (Individual)

250 Total Calories 46 Protein Calories. 1 Tomato. 1 teaspoonful Worcestershire sauce. 1-8 teaspoonful pepper. 1-2 teaspoonful salt. 1 egg. 2 slices bacon. Hollow out the tomato; put into the bottom of it one-half of the seasonings. Drop the raw egg into the hollow. Put the remaining seasonings on top. Cover with the slices of bacon placed in a cross fashion. Fasten the ends with toothpicks, if necessary. Bake very slowly in a moderate oven for twenty-five minutes.—June Good Housekeeping.

IMPORTANCE OF THE SMALL HERD

The breeder of cattle who owns only a few cows is an essential part of the farms that are carrying forward the interest of pure bred live stock. In many cases, however, he needs to understand more clearly his importance and to realize that the improvement of the breed he has selected is in his keeping and of others like him. While it is true that the sires of great reputation, and prize winners generally, are found in large herds, yet the large herds are comparatively few in number; an overwhelming majority of the good breeding cows are owned in small herds. The man with a small herd ought to exact his calling and especially ought he to recognize his responsibility in upholding the quality of the breed he has chosen. The advantages are far from lying altogether with the one who owns an extensive herd. The principles of breeding, the history of the breed, the experience of master breeders are alike accessible to the small herd manager. His methods of feeding and planning for developing the calf are not limited by the number of breeding cows owned. Sources of information open to the extensive breeder are not denied to the small one. The man with 300 cows in his home pasture probably knows more at the inter-annual than the man with ten. And while the bull in the big herd has an extensive opportunity to impress his excellence, yet the problems of mating may be essential to the small herd. The quality of the sires in the small herd is not so plentiful as in the large herd; it is apt to be found in the wholehearted application by the man at his best energies to the task in hand. The tendency to underestimate his opportunity and to underestimate his contribution to the sum of stock excellence is apt to lead to a pessimism, which causes him to fall to his best attainments.

IN MEMORIAM

MR. JOHN MUNN

Entered into rest on June 8th, 1920, after an illness extending for a period of about two years, Mr. John Munn, of Greek River, Lot 65, in the 71st year of his age. Mr. Munn was one of our most highly respected citizens. He also took an active interest in educational matters and until quite recently held the office of secretary of trustees.

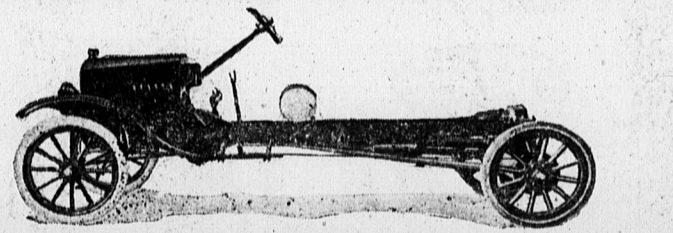

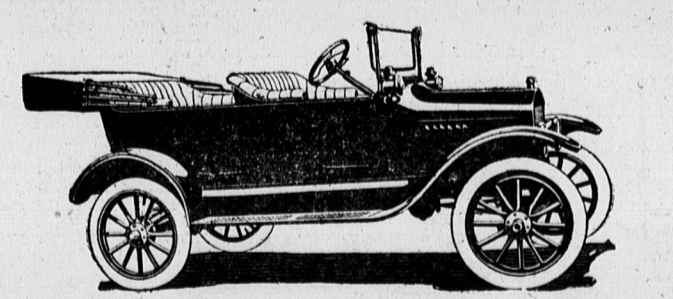
EGGS LOS ANGELES 1662 Total Calories 325 Protein Calories 8 hard-cooked eggs. 1 large bunch of asparagus. 2 tablespoonfuls butter. 1/2 teaspoonful paprika. 1/2 teaspoonful pepper. 1 teaspoonful salt. 1 cupful asparagus liquor. 1/2 cupful cream. Buttered bread-crumbs. Have the eggs lengthwise. Cut the tender portions of the asparagus in such lengths and parboil for fifteen minutes in salted water. Put in a small baking-dish put in one-half of the hard-boiled eggs, yolks up, and spread over the asparagus, which should be well drained. Then set on the remaining eggs, yolks down. Make a sauce of the butter, flour, asparagus, and asparagus liquor, and add to it the cream scalded. Pour this over the mixture in the baking dish, sprinkle with the crumbs, and bake fifteen minutes in a hot oven. —June Good Housekeeping.
