It is thought the spring's clean-up of gold in the Yukon will reach \$30,000,000, which looks exceeding well at this distance.

A Massachusetts telephone company is laying its wires all over that state and giving farmers each a telephone at \$12 in his own house. But not very many farmers in this Island would pay even that low rate for a phone.

The B. C. Colonist doubts whether that Province has increased in population fast enough to be entitled to additional representation. The fact is that B. C. has been considerably over-represented in the past.

Jerusalem now has not only railway connection with Jaffa, but also enjoys electric lights, telephones, phonographs, sanitary plumbing and most of the conveniences and comforts of civilized life. American windmills now find a market in Palestine, and the windmills are used for irrigation purposes. Beyrout has an American steam roller on its streets. Thus the new world is helping the old.

Rev. J. Idrisyn Jones of Anglo-Israel fame derives his second name in a curious way. The highest mountain in Wales is Snowdon, and the next highest is Mount Idrisyn. At the foot of this mountain lived long ago one of the numerous family of Jones, so plentiful in Wales. He was a bard, and was distinguished among the singers of Wales. His fellow-bards gave him the title of Idrisyn Jones, which has since been transmitted from eldest son to eldest son.

The mono-railroad, as the single rail system is called is not a novelty. There is one in Ireland, one in France and another in Belgium. It is now proposed to erect one between Manchester and Liverpool in England, where the distance of 35 miles will be covered in 15 minutes. The line in Ireland is between Listowell and Ballybunnion, a distance of 10 miles and has been in operation 10 years. It has been run at a high speed so far with out an accident. The single rail is elevated about three feet from the ground, and the cars and engine are hung across it in such fashion that the centre of gravity of the weight is slightly below the rail.

It is pleasing to learn that Lord and Lady Minto are to visit Charlottetown. Their Excellencies will leave Quebec on July 10 on board the Government steamer Minto, which will be specially fitted up for the occasion and will display the viceregal flag at the masthead. The following places will be visited in succession; Tadoussac, Chicoutimi, Gaspé Basin, Dalhousie, N. B., Caraquet, N. B., Charlottetown, P. E. I., Pictou, N. S., Bras d'Or Lakes, Sydney, Louisburg, Halifax, Yarmouth, St. John, Fredericton, St. Stephen, St. Andrews and Truro. From Truro the viceregal party will return by the Intercolonial Railway to Quebec.

The Electrical Review says that among all of Edison's marvellous inventions and discoveries there is none of broader utility than his recently announced storage battery for electricity. The old storage batteries were enormously heavy and rapidly leaked away the charge. Edison's discovery has changed and improved all this. The Review says:—It is hard to foresee all the meaning of this improvement. But we may look a little way and see the noiseless city, the suppression of the horse, and the automobile a factor of economic importance in general transportation. Electric tugboats will give new life to our canals, and with electric ferryboats will revolutionize our harbors. Electric torpedo boats of swiftness and secrecy will make present naval armaments of doubt

ful protection. The invention gives electricity a new foothold in its career of industrial conquest." Edison has reduced the weight of the battery from 180 to 55 pounds per horse-power, greatly reduced the time of charging, and increased the retentive power of the battery as well. An automobile can run 100 miles with once charging where before it could run but 30 miles.

King Edward has announced his intention of making a visit to Ireland and there is little doubt that he will be enthusiastically and loyally received.

At the end of the election trial in Fredericton, N. B. after Mr. Gibson's counsel had admitted corrupt practices by agents and the seat had been declared vacant, the following agreement was signed by leading Liberal supporters of Mr. Gibson and leading Conservative supporters of Rev. Dr. McLeod respectively:

We, the undersigned believing in the desirability of pure elections and speaking so far as we have authority for the Liberal and Liberal-Conservative parties in York county hereby agree that in all elections in the county they will refrain from the use of illegal and corrupt methods, and that they will use their influence to the utmost to prevent their respective parties from using such methods.

There is intense interest in the country to learn the total population of the Dominion by Provinces. This is no new thing in census years. We remember that when in Ottawa in 1881 a leading Opposition paper offered \$500 for first and exclusive information as to the population of Ontario, Quebec, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick. The information could not be obtained because the sole custodians of the secret outside of the Cabinet were sworn to secrecy. At length the figures were given out, first to only four or five newspapers. We include therefore that the reports so far published are merely guesses or estimates. Still the rumor persists that the returns are to be found disappointing. It was very distinctly so in Australia last year and the same may prove true of Canada. THE GUARDIAN sees no reason as yet to alter its estimate published months ago that the total will be between four and a quarter and four and a half millions.

AUTOMOBILE FOR THE SHAH OF PERSIA.

To Liege has fallen the honor of supplying the Shah of Persia with a suitable automobile, and a superb petroleum landau has just been despatched to His Majesty. The carriage contains five seats and the inside is lined with pearl grey brodered silk, while the motorbox is enamelled blue, picked out with gold and the body and wheels are colored a carmine. The lamps on either side have their glass adorned with a lion armed with a scimitar, with the Persian sun as a background. The cost of this magnificent car is \$4,400.

THE ELECTRICAL ASSOCIATION.

For the second time in the past ten years Ottawa will this month be the place of the annual convention of the Canadian Electrical Association. The convention, which will last three days, will open on June 19 and it is expected that about two hundred of the wizards of the wire from all over Canada will be present.
