DISTRICT AGRICULTURAL.—Last week Mr. Tennant the Representative for King's Co., was busy putting the Provincial orchard at Falconwood in good shape, and incidentally instructing Mr. Michael Coughlin in pruning Mr. Coughlin is becoming quite an expert in this line of work. In addition to the pruning the orchard has been thoroughly sprayed, with home made lime sulphur solution under the direction of Mr. Tennant. Mr. William Cass of North River and Mr. Leo McDonald of Glen Finnan assisted with the spraying. Mr. Cass has gone this week to Georgetown where he is spraying for the farmers in that locality. Mr. McDonald is working in the vicinity of Charlottetown at present. It is expected that another man will be started spraying in Summerside in a few days. The object of the Department in doing this work is to get a larger number of orchards in good shape, so that a large quantity of good clean fruit will be produced for marketing. It is the intention of the Department to follow this work up in the fall, and assist with the packing and selling of the apples.

HOUSE BURNED AT VALLEY STATION  
TRURO, May 19.—The residence of Edward Christie, Valley Station, caught fire probably from sparks on the roof, and was burned to the ground last evening. The contents of furniture, etc., were removed without much damage, but no apparatus was available to save the house.
