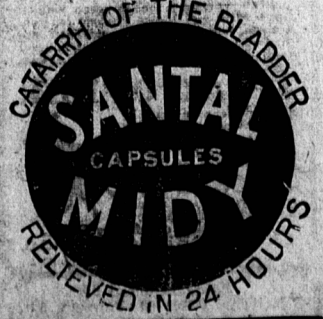

Following is the address:

Charlottetown, July 20, 1912. F. R. Newsom, Secretary and Business Manager, The Charlottetown Guardian.

WAS MCGEE SENTENCED

(Continued from page 1.) with consideration of the prisoner's sex, her conditions of life etc, etc, might materially modify her ultimate fate. In deliberate tones the prisoner was sentenced to be hanged on Oct. 10 between 8 a. m. and 4 p. m. at Georgetown Jail.

The prisoner on hearing sentence, cried "Hanged! Hanged! Hanged, hanged, hang me now and be done with it!" When taken outside the Court on return to the jail she grew especially violent, threw off her hat and tore her garments. She was eventually quieted to some degree.

The case of Smith vs Acorn for trespass battery and assault next came up for hearing, and the following jury was empanelled: Daniel Disher, Peter McLeod, Archd. B. McNeill, Wm. McCarron, John Morrison, Archd. Campbell, Peter McLeod, foreman. J. J. Johnson, K. C. Charlottetown; for the prosecution, Mr. Stewart of Georgetown for defendant.

Court adjourned at 1.15. The Supreme Court concluded its sitting at Georgetown this afternoon. In the case of McDonald vs McDonald, suit for trespass and title to land; won by the plaintiff McDonald. The case of trespass, and assault and battery, Smith vs Acorn; won by plaintiff Smith. Damages \$25.00 for trespass and \$50.00 for assault.
