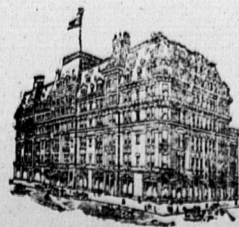

Dan. 3: 13-28.

GOLDEN TEXT

"The Lord is my helper, and I will not fear what man shall do unto me."—Heb. 13: 6.

POINTED SUGGESTIONS.

Possibly it was the duty of the Chaldeans who reported the default of the three Jewish lads in the matter of worshipping the golden image to reveal the fact to the King. But it is clear that they were not without motive for so doing. It was jealousy. And jealousy is a past master at that kind of subtle, vindictive little-tattle which is meant for the overthrow of others.

And while jealousy plans satisfaction and reward for itself out of the discomfiture of another, pride that has vaunted itself and been wounded seeks its honor in ways of furious revenge. Pride enraged will stop at nothing. Jealousy is said to be "the rage of a man," but wounded pride can overtop it in the wilderness of its rush upon the object of its displeasure. What does it matter to Nebuchadnezzar how many suffer, if by the quick vindication of his honor the offending Jews shall suffer? See how terrible is his countenance! Listen to the hot eagerness of his commands.

But well-grounded convictions—those which are deeply rooted in conscientious religious principles—are undaunted by ultimatums. There are those who may be frightened from their faith, but they are not those who are able to give a reason for the hope that is in them. Shadrach and his fellows put their whole case in the hands of Jehovah. "Our God," said they, "is able." But they rested their case more deeply than in the power of God. They placed it in His eternal wisdom and righteousness. They believed that things will keep with God. The possible triumph of a day is a trifle.

It takes more than the changing of names to drive principles out of the soul. The companions of Daniel, as well as himself, had been given names to conform to idolatrous belief and practice. Your parents might have given you a fancier name, but to measure up to the genuine heroism of the Jewish lads, you need to bring your life under the control of convictions which are anchored in God.

The temptation which leads men astray or because of which they deny their faith is, after all, never better than a hollow, plated thing. The image on the plains of Dura looked big enough and glittering enough to attract. But it was a man's toy, just the same. And what else is anything made of gold, of art or man's device? But which are you seeking to serve, gold or God?

What has keener sight than a guilty conscience? Is it not something significant that Nebuchadnezzar is the first to discern the form of a fourth person in the furnace? He was looking to see a quick ending to the men he had consigned to the flames, but conscience is an eye-opener. It reveals eternity to the soul.

The teaching of Jesus must not be forgotten by his followers at any time. Those who love God and are true to Him have always the presence of another with them. "Lo, I am with you, always."

Who are your companions? Daniel evidently had good ones. And they were well off in having Daniel as one of their's. Selected Christian companionship is the choicest privilege on this side heaven. It is heaven. Why take up with less than the worthy?

It is a mistake to suppose that one has to go to the Old Testament or to the days of the early Christian Church to find heroes and martyrs for the faith. Thank God, they are to be found there. And the stimulus of their example cannot be over-estimated. But their faith and courage and glorious heroism has been duplicated an hundredfold in modern days. Read the literature of missions, and glorify God.

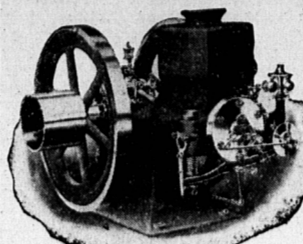

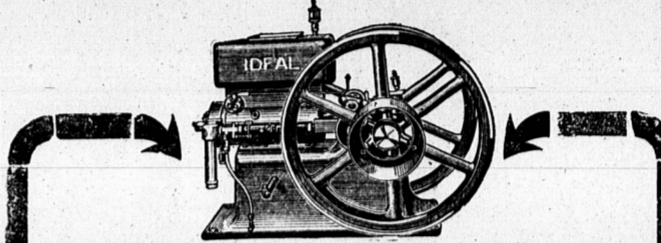
