**DEVONSHIRE RED CROSS.**— The report of Devonshire Red Cross Society for the month ending May 31, is as follows:— This Society has only been organized since November and has certainly done its share of the noble work. The members have also adopted a prisoner in Germany. Shipments of twenty-four (24) pairs of socks were sent on Dec. 20th, Jan. 17th, Feb'y 14th, March 14th and April 25. Also six pairs were given to the Siege Battery, making in all one hundred and twenty-six pairs of socks and thirty-five suits of pyjamas.

**P. E. ISLANDER DROWNED.**— Boston papers report that Paul Arnold, aged 33 years, a native of Bloomfield in this province lost his life by drowning at the old Metropolitan Coal Wharf, Chelsea, Mass. He was engaged in making repairs to a motor boat when the accident occurred. Nobody saw him fall from the boat, but his hat and pipe were found floating in the water by two companions, who went away but a short time. The Chelsea police grappled for the body till late in the evening, but their efforts were unavailing. Deceased leaves his wife, Elizabeth, two boys and a girl, the oldest ten years of age.

**WEDDING BELLS.**— A quiet wedding took place at noon on Tuesday, May 29th, at the home of Mrs. Geo. Wilson, Euston St., when her granddaughter, Miss Edith Alexandria Hayden, a popular young lady of this city, was united in marriage to Mr. Bois Harper Andrew, formerly of New Glasgow Mills. The ceremony was performed by Rev. J. Dugald McKenzie, of Zion Church, in the presence of only a few immediate relatives. Mr. and Mrs. Andrew received the congratulations of a host of friends at the R. R. depot on their departure for a short trip. On their return they will reside in Charlottetown.

**INTERESTING SERVICES.** Rev. R. H. A. Haslem, of Springfield, P. E. I., for many years a missionary in Kanga, India, preached in St. John's church on Sunday morning before a large congregation, and gave a most interesting account of the work, saying the war had helped the missionaries greatly in their dealings with the people of India, says a St. John exchange. He also spoke of the increasing demand among the people for recognition as a nation and for a self-contained government. One of the greatest problems that confronts the British Empire at the present day is the question as to whether men from India are to be admitted to the other parts of the empire. Rev. Mr. Haslem preached in Trinity in the evening, and again told of his work in India.

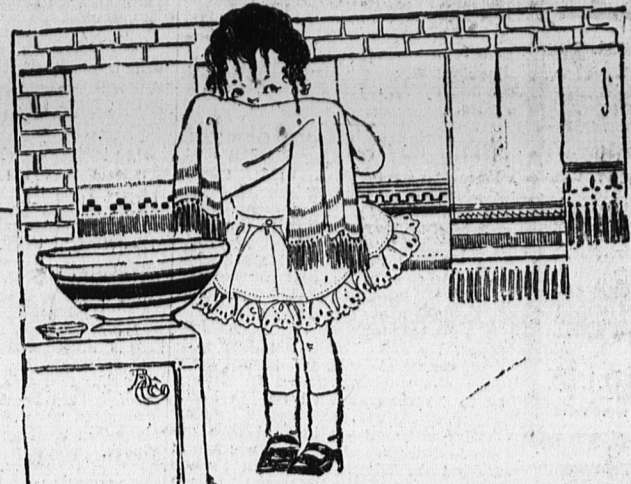
