Haegg, now training at Dartmouth for his American debut in next week's national A.U. championships in New York, says he does not expect to regain the form he displayed last summer when he broke seven records from 1,500 to 5,200 metres in about 10 weeks...

Although he is only 24, around the age when American tracksters begin to really find themselves, Haegg regards himself as over his peak. Since he arrived here Tuesday, accompanied by Sig Steinwall, former Dartmouth coach, and Axel Nordquist, the A.A.U.'s representative, the Swedish star has appeared uneasy about his lengthy American campaign...

All of Haegg's best running has been done in his homeland, particularly in Gavle, where he resides and works as a fireman. His current trip is the fourth he has made outside of Sweden...

According to the records kept by Nordquist, Haegg never has been at his best in foreign countries. After his record smashing orgy of a year ago Haegg competed in meets in Hungary, Germany and Poland and, while victorious in all of them, his times were comparatively slow...
