"JUST HOW" WITH FLOWERS.

Never put too many blooms in any one jar or vase. Flowers are seen in far greater advantage if loosely and simply arranged, and they last much longer, too, because they get more air and water.

If you are ever lucky enough to have too many flowers for your vases don't spoil their beauty by overcrowding them. Just put those that are left over in a tumbler or jam-jar hiding the makeshift vase with a plain cover made of stiff moustache paper.

You can obtain this useful commodity in all shades, either at an artist colorman's shop or from a photographer who caters for budding amateurs who mount their own prints.

Flowers with short stems, such as nasturtiums, pansies, or waterlilies, are always difficult to arrange daintily because they will slip down into the water.

SEVERAL USEFUL TIPS

A very good plan is to fill a bowl with water, and to throw into it a number of ordinary bottle caps. These you see, will buoy up your flowers and keep them in position, without showing at all.

Another good scheme is to stretch a piece of very coarse mosquito netting over an ordinary oval embroidery frame, and set it over a soup-plate or bowl filled with water. The stems of the flowers are then thrust through the net, which prevents the flowers from slipping.

Slender, clear-glass specimen vases, which only hold two or three blooms show off roses and carnations to the very best advantage, but they are apt to be top-heavy, and up-set if placed in the bottom of such glasses will make them as stable as a rock.

Legislative Assembly
PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND

Rules Relating to Private Bills:

All petitions for Private Bills must be presented within fourteen days after the commencement of the Session exclusive of adjournment.

No Private Bill shall be brought into the House, but upon a Petition first presented, truly stating the case at the peril of the suitors for such Bill, and such petition must be signed by the said parties.

A committee shall be appointed at the commencement of every session consisting of five members, of whom three shall be a quorum to be denominated "The Private Bills Committee," to whom shall be referred every Private Bill, and no proceeding after the first reading shall be had upon such bill until such committee has reported thereon to the House.

So soon as the Committee has reported any Bill, such Bill together with any amendments that may be suggested by the Committee, shall be printed at the expense of the parties who are suitors for such Bill, and printed copies thereof delivered to the members before the second reading, if deemed necessary by the Committee.

No Bill for the particular interests of any person or persons, Corporation or Corporations, or body, or bodies of people, shall be read a second time until all fees be paid for the same into the hands of the Clerk of the House.

No Bill having for its object the vesting in or conferring upon any person or persons, Municipality or Body Corporate the title to any tract of land shall be received or read in the House unless at least four weeks notice containing a full description of the land in question has been published in the ROYAL GAZETTE and one other newspaper in this Province of the intention of such person or persons, Municipality or Body Corporate to apply for such Bill.

pretty empty but hideous in use because their awkward shape makes the flowers fall anyhow. Don't despair, but arrange your treasures in a little circle of cardboard with a hole in it, placed over the mouth of the vase. It makes such a difference.

Change the water in the vase every day, and if you'll take the trouble to snip a tiny piece of the end of each stalk just as often, holding the end of the stalks under the water while you do so, you'll find your flowers will keep fresh much longer.

I say "under the water" because this prevents air getting up into the little stem tubes, thus hindering the flowers from drawing up as much moisture as they require.

See that no leaves are left on the stalks inside the vase either—if they are they will quickly decay and make the water stale.

SPANISH SOUP.

Put into the kettle one pound of meat over which pour 2 quarts soup stock, 1 can of tomatoes, 1 small onion, one bay leaf, few cloves, salt and pepper to taste. While ingredients cook slowly, take 6 dry red peppers, over them pour a cup of boiling water, let stand for a short while, until tender, pull apart throwing seed out, rub mixture until it thickens, strain into this mixture, dissolve one cup of grated fish, which must be added to the soup. Lastly, a tablespoonful of butter. This soup is generally strained, but if preferred can be used as a thick soup.
