EASTERN NOTES.—Digging is completed with few exceptions, and ploughing is now the chief business with farmers. The year has not been a favorable one for crops on account of the remarkably dry summer, and stock is shortened as much as possible through a large diminution in the bulk of hay and straw.—The cheese factories are closing for the season with a large shortage through poor pastures and obnoxious horn flies. Though the dry season was prejudicial to all vegetable growth it was favorable to insect existence and horn flies and potatoe bugs in immense numbers and increasing forces plied their nefarious avocations with a persistence and malignity exasperating to the farmer and detrimental to his interests.—Comparatively little produce is moving here at present; and nothing like the quantity of years ago will move as the farmer's energies are just turning in other and more profitable directions.—The weather has been too stormy for fishing, but codfish are supposed to be scarce. An immense school of dog fish has swarmed in our waters for some time rendering the catching of any useful fish nearly impossible. An abundance of squid is here at present, which will make excellent bait for codfish should they arrive in any quantities and should the dog fish leave. That energetic fisherman, Maynard Fraser has a trawl set off the harbor, but hasn't done much yet only killing dog fish.—The schools are resuming their studies, the teachers refreshed by the vacation, the scholars benefited by a change of occupation.—Cyrus N. Stewart and Silas Robertson have gone on a cruise to Boston.
