Currencies

(C.P. By Guardian's Special Wire) MONTREAL, June 6 - Pound sterling gained 5-16 cent to 4.93 23-32 on Montreal foreign exchange Saturday. The French Franc and the United States dollar held unchanged, the former at 4.46 cents and the dollar at 1-32 cent premium.

(A.P. By Guardian's Special Wire) NEW YORK, June 6—Quotations in foreign exchange today were overshadowed by the undiminished flow of hoarded gold to the London open market. In the narrow fluctuations most leading currencies gained in terms of the United States dollar.

Sterling rose 1-4 cent to \$4.93 5-8. The French Franc advanced .00 1-8 of a cent to 4.45 3-4. Swiss Francs also were higher. The Holland Guilder dipped slightly. The Canadian dollar eased 3-64 of a cent to 1.00 1-16.

MINING

(C.P. By Guardian's Special Wire) TORONTO, June 6 - W Toronto showing much life, the Toronto share market presented a generally firm front in the closing session of the week, the miscellaneous mines indices gaining about a point each and the gold measure firming narrowly.

Gold and base metals were irregular. The main trade appeared in the secondary and junior golds on a slight downward drift. Issues selling in considerable volume at losses of a few cents each included Bidgood-Kirkland, East Malartic, Francoeur, Hard Rock, Slave Lake, Stadacona, Sladen and San Antonio. Chibougamau and O'Brien dropped 10 to 15 cents each.

Along with Dome and Lake Shore, cheaper golds displaying moderate strength were Kerr-Addison, Kirkland Lake, MacLeod-Cockshutt, Perron, Read-Authier, Siscoe, and Savanite. Silvers were quiet and firm and in the base metals group the soft spots included Ford Orelle, Waite, Amulet and Sudbury Basin. Alderman and Chromium were up narrowly and Normetal advanced 18 cents to 1.50. Hudson Bay closed unchanged.

Fair action developed in the western oil group and Calgary-Edmonton closed at the top of a 15 cent gain. Home Oil and Okalta added 5 to 6 cents and gains were posted for several penny oils including Calmont, Highwood and United.
