—The funeral of Mrs. (Dr.) P. C. Murphy, whose sad and untimely death occurred on Thursday last, took place on Saturday morning, the remains being conveyed from Tignish to Alberton by special train, arriving there shortly before nine o'clock. The large concourse of people present of all denominations, including friends from Charlottetown and Summerside, was proof of the esteem in which the departed was held. She was a truly Christian woman, with heart of charity, and intelligence more than common. A choir composed of priests from different parts of the island, and the Tignish choir, directed by Professor Whitney of Summerside, sang the beautiful plaintive music of the Requiem, Mass. Father J. R. Murphy of St. Dunstan's College, and brother of Dr. Murphy, was the celebrant of the Mass. He also officiated at the grave. He was assisted by the pastor, Rev. F. L. Connolly. The funeral was one of the largest seen in Alberton for some time and was led by members of the C. M. B. A. and A. O. H. in uniform. J. E. Gallant of Tignish acting as Marshall. LIVED UNDER SIX BRITISH SOVEREIGNS
MONTREAL, May 25—A link with the past has been broken by the death yesterday, at the age of 92, of Mrs. Elizabeth Wilson Miles, the well known Canadian historian, who was formerly vice-principal of Bishop's College, and later Superintendent of Protestant Education in the Province. Mrs. Miles was born at Ripon, Yorkshire, England in 1819, and has thus lived under six sovereigns, namely George III, George IV, William IV, Victoria, Edward VII and George V.

THE DOCTORS' PROTEST.
BERLIN, May 25—The depth and persistency of the Anti-English feeling in Germany, which resulted from last summer's crisis in Anglo-German relations was demonstrated today by the refusal of the Potsdam board of Aldermen to vote funds for the entertainment of the British physicians who are to attend the convention of the royal institutes of public health in July. This convention enjoys the patronage of the highest official circles in Germany. "England treated us abusively and shamefully," and "England, who is hostile to Germany, wishes to press us against her icy bosom" are among the phrases uttered by the Aldermen of the city in which the Emperor has his residence, when giving their motives for the refusal to go to any expense in entertaining the British visitors.
