WASTED MILLIONS IN ELEVEN YEARS

LONDON, March 15—Judgment was given recently at the court of Bankruptcy on an application for discharge recently made by Mr. G. H. Freeman, who, on attaining his majority in 1898, became entitled to £240,000, the whole of which he has expended, and in addition has accumulated liabilities to the amount of about £20,000. His assets, it is stated, may possibly realize £10,000. The bankrupt's losses have been apportioned as follows: Upwards of £30,000 in owning and running race-horses. £22,700 by betting. £32,800 in Stock Exchange speculations. £25,900 in theatrical ventures. Household and personal expenditure between £9,500 and £10,000 a year. His Honor overruled a charge of misconduct which had been made by the Official Receiver, and having regard to the amount of capital at the bankrupt's disposal, said he could not uphold the charge of unjustifiable extravagance in living. He had, however, contributed to his speculation and gambling, and his conduct in that respect had been extraordinarily reckless and foolish. Although he might acquander his own money, he was not entitled to incur heavy liabilities as well, and his discharge would be suspended for two and a half years from this date.
