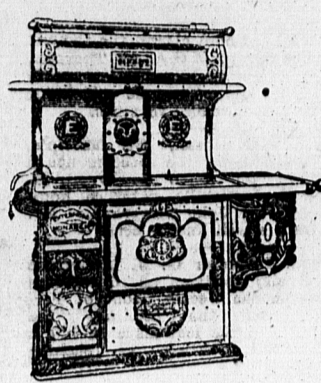

Yesterday to look after a large consignment of potatoes which were being sent to Havana on the Thompson Line steamer Haakon VII, which vessel sailed last night. The Haakon VII, which sailed yesterday for Havana direct, had besides 12,000 barrels of potatoes, a cargo consisting of 6,000 bushels of oats, 200 tons of hay and 600 packages of fish.

Mr. Thompson said last night that this was the largest cargo of produce ever shipped from St John to Havana.

EX-POLICEMAN ARRESTED ON SERIOUS CHARGE

ST. JOHN, Feb. 13—Frank Bowes, an ex-policeman, was arrested last evening by Patrolmen Scott and McCollom on three charges, and will appear in the police court this morning. Between 9 and 10 last evening Bowes went into Cusack's bar on the Marsh road and, it is charged, being somewhat under the influence of liquor, started in to clean out the saloon. The proprietor found it a difficult task to keep the man from breaking the glasses in the establishment and called the police. Bowes, the police say, on learning of the situation, somewhat under a hasty exit. About half an hour later the officer at central police station was again informed that Bowes was in Brunswick street disturbing the residents of that locality by his loud talk. Policemen Scott and McCollom found Bowes easily. He resisted arrest and the police say he struck McCollom.

Bowes left the police force last August. He was considered a good policeman.

Policeman Scott arrested Thomas Gibson last evening on a warrant charging him with assaulting Arthur London. The prisoner will appear before Magistrate Ritchie in the police court this morning.
