We had three earnest and able advocates of the Tunnel and of Provincial Rights in Messrs Martin, McLean and Lefurgey. They were, however in political opposition to the Government of the day, Mr. Hughes, the one Liberal member for the Province, happened to represent the county most distant from and least interested in the Tunnel project, and moreover was naturally desirous to retain the advantages of the winter port at Georgetown. As a consequence Mr. Hughes was by no means active as a Tunnel man.

Now the situation is changed. We have three men of ability and influence, supporting the Government of the day, representing the metropolitan and western counties, where the Tunnel project is strongest in public favor, and one representative from Kings who is opposed to the Government, but understood to be in favor of the Tunnel on broad provincial and national grounds. It would appear from this that we are in a better position to influence the Government to take up this great work than we have been heretofore.

There is still another point in our favor. The earnest cooperation of the Provincial Government with the efforts of our representatives at Ottawa is highly important. Unfortunately the exigencies of party have been such that while the Liberal Provincial Government and Legislature are on record as unanimously in favor of the Tunnel they would not work harmoniously with its Conservative advocates at Ottawa. This was most regrettable, but was perhaps inevitable where the party spirit is so much in evidence as it is. This obstacle is now removed.

And all pretenses for delays and evasions have been removed. Three members go to Ottawa who are in favor of the Tunnel and who will have the favorable ear of the Government there. Our Provincial Government, also pronounced in favor of the Tunnel is in political accord with the members we send to Ottawa and with the party in power there. Such are the favorable conditions which now surround the Liberal party in its relations to the Tunnel.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier during the recent campaign told a Quebec audience that the Tunnel would yet be built. Mr. Fielding expressed here in Charlottetown his personal willingness to support the Tunnel project if the work can be done for ten millions (as it can be) or even a considerable more, but said they had not yet sufficient information. May we not hope that now, under the favorable conditions existing, and after the long delay of twelve years, the necessary information will be at once obtained? Also, that our provincial government and our new representatives in Parliament will urge the matter forward with all possible energy?

The Presidential election in the United States comes off next Tuesday, November 3.

Both the party leaders, Sir Wilfrid Laurier and Mr. Borden, had very large majorities in two constituencies each. Sir Wilfrid represents Ottawa and Quebec cities; Mr. Borden represents Halifax and the county of Carleton in which Ottawa is situated. They will probably choose to sit for Quebec and Halifax respectively.

The Laurier Government's majority is large enough in any case, but there is a considerable difference between The Guardian's and The Patriot's advices so far.

The Guardian has received in printed form the platform of the Liberal Conservative party in this Province and the speech of Mr. Mathieson in support of the same. The principal planks deal with Provincial Rights, Agriculture, Education, Public Works Reform of the Election Laws, and Public Accounts. Under provincial rights are included the Province claims for the cost of the Island Railway, damages for non-fulfillment of the terms of union, fair transportation rates, the Tunnel, compensation in respect of the public lands given to the larger Provinces, increased per capita subsidy, our share in the Fishery Award, and restoration of our lost representation at Ottawa. Other prominent features are vote by ballot, reform of the election laws, the appointment of an Auditor General with like powers to the Auditor General of Canada and a thorough investigation of the public accounts by competent and independent accountants.

HUBBARD SQUASH AND PUMPKINS.

Hubbard squash is not used to the extent that it should be in this country. In England and the United States this vegetable is very much prized. As a vegetable it is unequalled and for pie making it is all that could be desired. Pumpkins, is another vegetable coming more into use every year, and a good pumpkin pie goes to the right spot every time.

Then again pumpkins make grand preserve, a 20c. pumpkin will produce as much preserve as one dollar's worth of plums. Cranberries should be used more extensively than they are, they correct the liver, and have a beneficial effect on the kidneys and purify the blood.

It would be exasperating to give all this information if we were not in a position to point out where to procure those articles and at a very reasonable figure.
