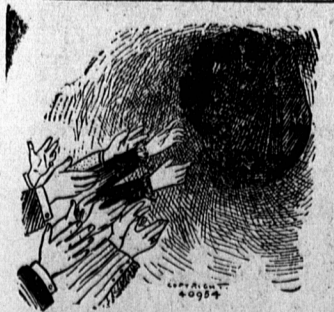

BROOKLYN, N. Y., Feb. 17.—Miss Henrietta Schlatzlein, a Sunday school teacher, seventeen years old, who had been missing from her home Stillman avenue, Brooklyn, for over a week, returned yesterday, and told a story which caused two young men to be arrested and locked up. Miss Schlatzlein disappeared from the Young Women's Christian Association on building a week ago last night, and a thorough search had been made for her ever since. On her return she told her parents she had been with friends, but this did not give satisfaction and the police were notified.

Acting Captain O'Connor, with two other police officers, questioned the girl, who finally admitted that on leaving the Association rooms, where she had been to attend a sewing class she met two young men, who took her to a moving picture show in Flatbush avenue.

Afterwards the three went to a "clubhouse" near by, where they stayed until morning. The girl said she was then afraid to go home, and stayed at the "clubhouse" for two days. At the end of that time one of the young men took her to a furnished room house in Bedford avenue, where she took a room under the name of Alice Maywood.

She says the men had hypnotic influence over her and she stayed in the room without question. They supplied her with food and paid the rental of the room. She learned of the search being made for her on Monday and yesterday decided to return home.

NORTH TRYON HORSE NOTES.

Horsemen in this section are preparing their horses that are supposed to have considerable speed for a series of Ice Races that are being arranged by some of the lovers of speed. These races are due to take place during the latter part of February. It is expected that meetings will be arranged and that races will be held at Cape Traverse, Tryon, North Tryon, and Victoria.

Ives Millpond is at present in excellent condition for horse trotting. Some of the local horsemen are seen daily showing their mares to a crowd of spectators who are often amazed as they see some of the great bursts of speed shown by some of the green horses.

Frank Welch's King Brazilian 224 still shows his old time form. King Brazilian has been in the stud in this province for the past few years and has been producing some excellent stock.

Wm. E. (Bert) Dawson showed up a good one in the chestnut pacing mare Ola D. by Brazilian 2.19 dam June Morning 2.36; she is one of the best green pacers that has appeared around this settlement for a long spell. But is very anxious to get a mark at Camden Holland's fast paced horse Rosville.

James Chisolm also has a three year old Kalol colt that is a nice galloper and he knows how to carry himself in company having perfect action and fine manners.

Newton Dawson, who marked Lee-wood 2.27 1/2, Loater 2.34, June Morning 2.37, Lady Eveline 2.24 and who also raised some of the best racing material on this Island, has a two year old stallion—sired by that Kentucky bred horse Lord Hastings that is showing up wonderfully.

Frank Lang is handling a fine big splendidly gaited colt for Luke Woods. Frank's own mare Campbellton Bell is laid up with a badly injured leg. He is in hopes of having her in condition to take part in the races that are going to take place shortly.

Robert Simmons is offering for sale his fine stock horse Parkright by Parkwood. He is a well built horse as well as a gentle and safe horse to drive.

Robert E. Oulton is handling a six year old bay trotter (breeding unknown). This gelding will likely make a fast one for the races next season. She is heavily staked and is sound, a great individual and is said to have worked halves in 1.12.

The King Brazilian pacing mare owned by Freeman Welch has been showing considerable speed and in time will no doubt be one of the fastest green ones on the Island.

That celebrated stallion Burk sired by June Day was seen passing through this vicinity several days ago and he showed speed equal to that of the famous Maud S. when she was in her old time form.

The handsome Chestnut mare owned by James Lord is said to be in foal to Mayor Todd. The offspring will no doubt be something pretty nice as this mare is considered one of the best brood mares in this vicinity. Charles Pooley one of the prominent horsemen of this section has been showing up daily on the ice with his trotting stallion Gamie Brazilian and is said to be doing some great work.

Alfred Kehoe, who last winter developed the fast pacer Alfred K., had the misfortune to fracture his hand some driving horse's forward leg. The horse is at present in slings and is reported as doing well.

Martin Kehoe has recently been seen on the ice with a hobbled pacer sired by Lord Hastings and is reported as showing lots of speed considering the amount of training he has had.

TOKIO STILL RIOTS AGAINST MINISTRY.

TOKIO, February 18.—Further disturbances have occurred here. More than 200 persons were arrested following anti-government riots. The nights are disturbed by continued disorders and 500 policemen are kept busy dispersing mobs and protecting government buildings. Editions of newspapers are being suppressed and others have been seized because of attacks against the ministry. A mass meeting has been called when resolutions will be adopted condemning the government because of the high taxes.

READING, Pa., February 18.—Daniel A. Ney, a contractor, died today from a peculiar cause. Mr. Ney had in the center of his forehead a protruding blood vessel, a birthmark. He was carried into the house but died before a doctor arrived.

LONDON, Feb. 17.—The issue of the Canada Steamship Lines, Limited, of \$1,000,000 five per cent. bonds, launched yesterday, has received pleasing notices in the London financial press. A much larger issue could have been underwritten, as applications are very numerous.

TOKIO, February 17.—Serious disturbances have occurred in connection with the agitation against the ministry at Osaka. Mobs today stoned tram cars and the Revenue building. The disturbances are in part the outcome of the agitation for lower taxes.
