Writing from Haparanda, Sweden, (the most northern railroad point in Europe) to Mr. J. E. B. McGready, Dr. Young says: "After a frightful hardship I finally got here. There was no other way out of Russia. I am working my way to Stockholm. I don't know how to get to America, but will try Bergen, Norway."

FAR EAST AUTO TRIP—Mr. Morris F. Austin and family have just returned from a long automobile trip to the "far east". They left Manchester, says the New Hampshire Exchange, some little time ago for Prince Edward Island by automobile, with the idea of using their car as far as it was practicable on the journey. They drove as far as St. John, N. B., which is probably the "farthest east" ever driven by a local automobilist. Speaking of the trip Mr. Austin said he found the roads through Maine excellent, and far superior to the average country roads of New Hampshire, and until they crossed the border they encountered no difficulties. From the state line of Maine to St. John the road was of red clay, and as it had been raining for four or five days they were terribly wet and muddy, but the trip was made safely and without accident. He stated that many of the bridges were nothing but round logs laid across the streams, and a number of bad mud holes in the road logs were rolled in to make them passable. Another machine was making the trip, with which Mr. Austin came up, and it made things easier for in case either car got stuck in the mud the other could be used to pull it out. Leaving the machine in St. John, the Austins made the rest of the trip by rail, and Mr. Austin said he was glad he did, although from all he could learn the roads from St. John east were much better, but he found when he arrived at Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, that the use of automobiles were only allowed three days a week, and then only on one road and for a distance of only fifteen miles to another town. Mr. Austin who is an enthusiastic trout fisherman, came home with tales of trout fishing on the Island which make his friends envious. He states that he never saw such angling, and had the greatest sport in his life that he ever enjoyed in his life. He is already planning for a fishing trip to the famous territory next season.
