A. By Law for levying and specifying the rate of assessment on Real Estate and Personal Property in the City of Charlottetown for a Water and Sewerage fund under Statute 1, Edward VII Chapter 2.

It is enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown as follows:— The rate of assessment on Real Estate for a Water and Sewerage fund under said Statute for the year commencing the first day of January A. D. 1908 and ending the thirty first day of December A. D. 1908 is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of one per cent on every dollar of the value of Real Estate as assessed by the Assessors of the Said City of Charlottetown in the general assessment Book and Valuation Roll of all Real Estate and Personal Property liable to taxation in said City and all persons liable to pay Poll Tax therein made and duly returned by them on the 10th day of May A. D. 1908.

2nd. The rate of assessment on Personal Property for each Water and Sewerage Fund for the year commencing the first day of January A. D. 1908 and ending the thirty first day of December A. D. 1908 is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of one quarter of one per cent on every dollar of the value of Personal Property as assessed by the assessors of the Said City in said general assessment Book and Valuation Roll made and duly returned by them as aforesaid.

3rd. The amount of Poll tax to be paid by every person returned by the said assessors in the said general assessment Book and Valuation Roll as liable thereto for each water fund under said Statute for the year commencing the first day of January A. D. 1908 and ending the thirty first day of December A. D. 1908 is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of twenty five cents on every poll of every person so assessed and returned as aforesaid.

A. By law for levying and specifying the rate of assessment on Real Estate and Personal Property in the City of Charlottetown for general civic purposes under Statute 3, Edward VII Chapter 17.

It is enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown as follows:— 1st. The rate of assessment on Real Estate for general civic purposes under said Statute for the year commencing the first day of January A. D. 1908 and ending the thirty first day of December A. D. 1908 is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of one and one eighth per cent on every dollar of the value of Real Estate as assessed by the assessors of the said City of Charlottetown in the General Assessment Book and Valuation Roll of all Real Estate and Personal Property liable to taxation in said City and of all persons liable to pay Poll Tax therein made and duly returned by them on the 10th day of May A. D. 1908.

2nd. The rate of assessment on Personal Property for such general civic purposes for the year commencing the first day of January A. D. 1908 and ending the thirty first day of December A. D. 1908 is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of one and one eighth per cent on every dollar of the value of Personal Property as assessed by the assessors of the said City in the said General Assessment Book and Valuation Roll made and duly returned by them as aforesaid.

A. By law for allowing the rate of Discount on the assessments on Real Estate and Personal Property in the City of Charlottetown for general civic purposes for the current year ending the thirty first day of December A. D. 1908.

It is enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown as follows:— 1st. A discount at the rate of two and one half per cent shall be allowed to all Tax payers who shall, on or before the twentieth day of July A. D. 1908 pay the City Clerk at his office the taxes severally due by them for the current year on Real Estate and Personal Property for civic purposes.

WORKMAN'S AWFUL FALL TO DEATH. NIAGARA FALLS, N. Y., June 9.—Antonio Forgoine, of No. 238 Nineteenth street, was fatally injured in a fall over the high bank into the gorge below the falls at midnight last night. Forgoine was in the employ of the Niagara Falls Hydraulic Power and Manufacturing Company as a driller. He was operating a steam drill on a ledge of rock at the edge of the bank, and in moving his machine it became overbalanced and toppled towards the edge. Forgoine in trying to save it, hung on too long and was pulled over the edge with it. The machine and man tumbled a complete somersault in the descent, and in landing the heavy drill fell upon the unfortunate man crushing him. He lived until his companions got him to the top of the gorge and to the hospital.

RUSSIAN TROOPS GROWING RESTLESS. ST. PETERSBURG, June 9.—A new cloud is looming in the Government's horizon in serious respect among the troops. The only stay of the administration in case of an open rupture with Parliament, evidence of which is being received from many quarters. In addition to the Kurak troubles, which, in spite of the official disclaimer that they are of a political character, are known to have been fomented by Revolutionists, there is open fomentation among the garrison at Odessa, while the Cossacks at Rostoff, Odessa and elsewhere are muttering because of the long time they have been absent from their homes. In addition, it is learned that the new recruits instead of reverifying the loyalty of the army, have infected the ranks still further with the Revolutionary virus which is so widespread among the peasantry.
