Livestock Market

MONTREAL, Que., Dec. 17.—Livestock offered for sale today on the two Montreal livestock markets amounted to 319 cattle and 241 lambs, 640 hogs and 163 calves. The cattle were practically all stripper cows of canner and cutter quality.

Sales were very drafty at prices from \$3.25 and \$3.50 for canners to around \$4.25 for cutters and up to \$4.50. Common bulls sold for \$5 to \$5.50, for those weighing between 600 and 1,100 pounds.

Yearling grass calves sold as low as \$5. Grassers of better quality sold from \$5.50 to \$6.25. Veal calves sold from \$12 to \$15, according to quality. The most common price for lambs was \$11.50 with bucks between \$9.50 and \$10 and bulls \$9.50.

Hogs were from \$11.50 to \$12.25 with practically all sales on a basis of \$12, either flat or graded. Sows were from \$10 to \$10.50.

Natural Resources Are Returned To Provinces of Manitoba and Alberta

OTTAWA, Dec. 16.—The agreements for the return of natural resources to the Province of Manitoba and Alberta were signed in the Privy Council Chamber yesterday. The Manitoba agreement was the first to be signed. Following that, the Alberta representatives signed the agreement. A statement expressing satisfaction at the conclusion of the Manitoba agreement was handed out by Premier John Bracken.

The agreements have to be ratified by the Dominion Parliament and the Legislatures of the two provinces before they become effective.

Under the agreements Manitoba gets back her natural resources retains her annual subsidy of \$562,000, which will be increased up to a maximum of \$1,125,000 as her population increases, and a flat sum of \$4,500,000 in payment of the alienated lands previous to 1912.

Alberta gets her natural resources back, receives the same subsidy as Manitoba, with the same provisions

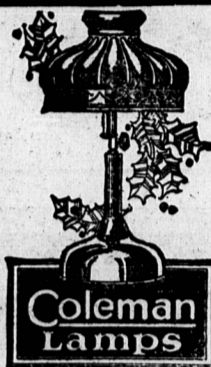
