The pamphlet contains a list of every person who has received this medal or a cash award since the institution of the Hero Fund, with a brief description of the act, performed to merit the award. The names of Miss Bertha Rattenbury of this city, J. A. Grady and D. J. Campbell, of Souris, who have received this medal and cash awards from the Hero Fund, appear in their respective order. Since the institution of the Hero Fund 4621 applications for awards have been received by the Commission; of these 330 were granted, 3494 refused, and 791 are pending the decision of the Commission.
