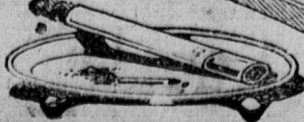

THE CHILD AND THE SCHOOL BENCH

The commencement of the annual crippling process of our children will begin before many weeks have passed. The schools will take from their beautiful out-of-door play the youngsters—whose vertebrae are made up to a considerable degree of cartilage, and are therefore soft and easily pushed out of shape—and put them in ill-arranged seats, forcing them to keep comparatively still, while the superimposed weight of the upper parts of the body, combined with the faulty positions assumed, does its work of destruction to an extent, as regards numbers, not even guessed by the general public. Statistics show that a very large percentage of school children have Scoliosis. As Dr. Royal Whitman says in his Orthopedic Surgery "Lateral curvature of the spine is one of the most common of deformities," and it is increasing in direct ratio as the school curriculum is becoming more exacting. A decided change for the better can be made in our schools. The sessions should be broken up. Department always bulks large in the school report, and one of the main infractions against "good deportment" is that of simple moving about in the seat, especially when the pupil turns and looks toward the back of the room, thus healthfully twisting the spine. CANADA SENDING US LOTS OF PULP.
